# 2 What estos ProCall is able to offer you

The estos ProCall is a Unified Communications software suite for business. It combines computer-supported telephony (computer telephony integration, CTI) with features for company wide (and beyond company boundaries) online collaboration.

The estos ProCall provides a broad feature set for communication and collaboration with remote call control, conference, presence information, instant messaging, chat and SMS text messaging.

The estos ProCall with its various configuration options adapts perfectly for your personal daily working needs. The estos ProCall integrates well with your favourite applications for e-mail and contact data administration and optimises seamless your workflow and communication processes for business purposes.

Learn more about the essential functions and performance features of estos ProCall here:

# 2.1 See Contact search: Find information about the current contact.

estos ProCall automatically searches in case of an incoming or outgoing call for the appropriate contact information, based on the phone number (particularly the call partner) and displays this information. Which contact data sources are searched and in which order, can be defined in the configuration of the estos ProCall and (by the administrator) in the estos UCServer. If more contacts are found from several data sources for that phone number, the contact data which was last used is displayed as active.

Further you are able to search for the contact data of a person in the search window of estos ProCall by entering a name or parts of it. Then start the call or other activities from the contact detail window.

# 2.2 ActiveContacts - actively manage contacts

The ActiveContacts technology in estos ProCall shows further information in addition to the contact data and the phone status of the user, e.g., calendar data of Microsoft Outlook®. The information is constantly updated in "real time". Therefore, you are always informed when and how your contacts are accessible. You are able to start and control the communication via a software menu, depending on the available information.

# 2.3 Presence – see the availability of your contacts

Every user connected to the system owns a status further on reffered to as *Presence*. This information is aggregated according to defined rules based on the status of several services: Telephony status (telephony service), calendar status (calendar service), login-log off (system service) and the manually entered status, provided by the user.

The presence shows at any time the current availability of the person you wish to communicate with.

You find an overview of the displayed presence symbols and their meaning under Presence symbols.

# 2.4 Pederation - The trustworthy network

A federation is a secured structure for the communication between members of different organisations (e.g. two companies, company and customer) with the aim to improve cooperation.

Within the federation, presence management permits the exchange of current information about the accessibility/availability of people, even beyond organisation boundaries. So, a suitable method of communication can be selected (e.g. phone, e-mail, chat, etc.).

Within the frame of the federation, every organisation defines which information is revealed and decides which services and systems are used for the exchange of this information.

# 2.5 🗐 Journal - tracking and planning communication

The estos UCServer journal informs you about all communication events, e.g. completed phone calls, missed calls and unavailable call participants. The information can be filtered and arranged according to different criteria.

The journal entries can be edited, marked, provided with notes and shared with other users.

All details for future telephone calls can be collected and edited upfront.

This allows you to keep an overview of your entire communications at all times. Important information cannot get lost anymore.

## 2.6 Audio/VideoChat - Realtime communication using WebRTC

The estos ProCall enables an ad-hoc communication with other users via Audio/VideoChat. This is supported within the enterprise network and using federation accross enterprise network boundaries.

# 3 Installation and Base configuration

The installation of the estos ProCall can be done in various ways.

The Base configuration of the estos ProCall is done directly after the successful installation of the software.

#### 3.1 Installation

The installation of the estos ProCall can be done in various ways.

- Requirements
- Manual installation at a workstation by the .msi file
- Installation via update service via estos UCServer and the server-side remote installation and update service.
- Installation using group policies in a network domain

## 3.1.1 Requirements

#### Requirements for the installation:

## 3.1.2 Installation at the workplace

To start the installation at the workplace please double-click the .msi file. This starts the Windows® installer leading through the installation procedure. Several configuration options are offered to the user:

#### **Version Information**

The exact version number is displayed on the homepage.



If the estos ProCall is installed at a 64 bit operating system a message is shown that a 64 bit version of the TAPI driver shall be installed if required.

#### License

The licence agreement has to be read and accepted by the user before the installation can be continued.

## **TAPI-driver**

The latest version of estos ProCall doesn't require a TAPI driver for communication with the estos UCServer anymore. All functions are provided by direct communication now. This simplifies the installation and maintenance of the software even more in Terminal Server environments. During configuration the following options can be selected:

Do not install a Tapi driver

- Installation of the client TAPI driver
   The client TAPI driver allows third parties the dialing via TAPI. The driver uses estos ProCall as a connection with the estos UCServer to carry out the dialing process. No additional TCP/IP connection is required and the installation and servicing of terminal servers are considerably easier than with TAPI
- Installation of the enhanced remote TAPI driver
  With the help of this driver, third party manufacturer's software can use all functions via TAPI and the estos UCServer. Nevertheless, this driver needs another TSP/IP connection with the server.

#### **Automatic Software Updates**

The user may decide here if the estos ProCall should be updated automatically. In this case a local update service is installed to the local Windows® system. The update service stays connected with the central estos UCServer for updating the client software if required.



The related software update service needs to be activated at the central estos UCServer to run the remote software updates successfully.

#### Connection to the server

Please enter the server here to be connected with the estos ProCall.

The server name or its IP address is entered in the input field when using static configuration. By using **Find Server** ... all available servers of the local network are listed in a window. The following information is shown regarding the servers found:

Computer name	Computer name of the server
Version	Information about the installed version of the estos UCServer
Method of localization	Broadcast means, that the server has answered a search inquiry on the local network.  DNS service record means, that the server was setup in the DNS as a service provider.

If a DNS Service Location Record is used for the configuration of the server the estos UCServer should be found and configured automatically.



The setup of a server side DNS Service Location Record is further explained in the help system of the estos UCServer.

Once the target folder for the program installation is entered the software installation completes by installing all files on the system.

Afterwards please start the Base configuration by activating the checkbox and select finsish.

#### 3.1.3 Installation via update service

The estos ProCall can also be installed on the workstations by the estos UCServer integrated update service. A Windows® system service will be installed on the workstation executing the installation procedure including the central base configuration loaded from the estos UCServer. The remote installation doesn't require a user intervention. Once finished the Windows® system service supervises the client software version running and

starts the update procedure if necessary.

The user is informed about events and the installation progress in a bubble popup at the system tray. A manual intervention of the user is not possible while running remote installations.

The system requirements and the setup of the server based central software installation and update service are described at the help system of the estos UCServer.

## 3.1.4 Installation using group policies

You can install workstations in the network automatically with the help of the group policy. Proceed as follows:

- 1. Define which components should be installed on the single workstations. Use the Windows® Installer in administrator mode for this. Start *msiexec/a client.msi*. You can now define a directory in which the prepared installation should be copied.
  - This need to be an accessible network share. Then select the software components to be installed on the workstations and specify the estos UCServer computer.
- 2. Start the Active Directory® user and computer management console in which you configure your domain users. Group your users (or computers) in such a way that you have organisational units. You can create group guidelines for each organisation-unit which controls the automatic installation of software.

Open an organisatonal unit's properties.

Go to Group policy. Add a new group policy.

Open group guidelines with Edit.

Add either under computer configuration - software settings - software installation or under user configuration - software settings - software installation a new package.

Then select the installation package previously prepared via the administrative installation. Read the appropriate documentation on Windows Server®, Active Directory® and group policies.

## 3.2 Base configuration

The base configuration of the estos ProCall occurs directly after the installation of the software. The base configuration can also be started any time later via the Windows® start menu at the **estos ProCall Workstation Settings**. The following configuration options are available:

- Language selction of the estos ProCall
- Select estos UCServer
- User log-in information in the estos UCServer
- User settings: general user information
- User settings: contact address and user profile picture
- User settings: telephone numbers
- User settings: services
- Groupware connection
- Exchange Web Services
- Start options

Basic user settings are to be done by the **estos UCServer Administrator**. Beside the central configuration several options can be configured at the workstation using the *estos ProCall workstation settings*. This way it is possible to fully maintain the workstation settings. If the user got the right from the administrator to configure the workstation settings by himself the user may change the settings anytime.



The configuration of specific configuration options requires administrative estos UCServer access rights. The user may need to login as administrator in this case. At the related configuration page a login option as administrator appears.



If you are using a active directory based usermanagement, there are some settings a user cannot change.

#### 3.2.1 ProCall language

By default estos ProCall will use the current language set by the user for Windows®. If this language is not available the estos ProCall will use english as its language.

If you want to change the language of the client, you can do this with the estos ProCall workstation setup. Administrators can define the language with Active Directory® group policies. This prohibits changes by the user.

## 3.2.2 Connection to the server

The responsible estos UCServer can find estos ProCall through different ways:

## Static estos UCServer configuration

With static configuration the host name or the IP address of the estos UCServer is required. Via the button **Search servers...** all estos UCServer available on the network can be displayed. Afterwards select the correct estos UCServer.

Use DNS service location record

By activating option Use DNS Service Location Record a

By activating option **Use DNS Service Location Record** all necessary information about the Domain Name Service is provided to the Client.

#### Secure encrypted connection (TLS) is required

This option will force encrypted data transmission between estos UCServer and estos ProCall. A corresponding certificate must be stored on the estos UCServer computer.

#### Use these settings for all users

estos ProCall supports hosting scenarios in terminal server environments in cooperation with several independent estos UCServer instances.



The Use These Settings for All Users checkbox will only be available on the system-wide server configuration dialog.

Activate this checkbox if you use *only one* estos UCServer system or all users on this computer (especially for terminal servers) should only use one estos UCServer system. With this option, all users on the computer will be use the system-wide settings.

If you use several estos UCServer instances and the users of one computer (especially for terminal servers) should connect to different estos UCServer instances, this checkbox should *not* be activated. Thereby, the server connection data will specified explicitly for each user logged in and may be configured optionally from the workstation setup dialog from the Server Configuration for This User tab or from Login Account through estos ProCall.



A user-specific configuration of the server connection data will be taken into consideration by estos ProCall, the SDK components and the advanced remote TAPI driver. In contrast, the automatic updating service and the multiline TSP will always use the system-wide server configuration, regardless of the server configuration for all users.

## 3.2.3 User authentication

The estos UCServer supports two options for the user authentication:

Decide either to log-in with your Windows® user name or provide the user name and the password which were configured in the estos UCServer for you.



If users are administered in the estos UCServer, a new user profile can be entered with a *New* user name after authentication as estos UCServer administrator.

#### 3.2.4 User settings: general user information

Here you can enter or update the user's information.

Property	Description
User name (login)	This is the user name for logging onto the estos UCServer service. If Active Directory® is used, this name will be the same as the Windows® login name.
Identity	The user's identity to be clearly identified in the Federation scenario. This identity address ideally corresponds to the e-mail address of the user. Therefore this user is also accessible via the Federation from outside of the company.
First name	The user's first name (e.g. Arthur).
Last name	The user's last name (e.g. Dent).
Displayed name	This is the user's full name (e.g. Arthur Dent). This can occur several times and is only used for display purposes. If the field is empty, a suggestion is automatically shown when the first and last name are entered.
Email Address	This is the email address of the user. Among other things, it will be used for notifying the user about missed calls and voice-mail messages.
(UC- )Password	The section for changing the password will only be displayed, if the user has been authenticated by estos UCServer itself. If Active Directory® is used, this section will not be displayed.

## 3.2.5 User settings: contact address and user profile picture

Here you can enter the contact address of the user or update and add a user's profile picture.

Contact address shows all relevant contact details for the user. You may add a contact picture, which will be shown on various places in estos ProCall. This picture will be shown to server users and to federated contacts depending on the given permissions.



If Active Directory® is used for user management, this information will be displayed for review by the

user and cannot be changed.



The user picture will be scaled free of distortions when added or loaded.

## 3.2.6 User settings: phone numbers

The user's phone numbers are displayed as provided in his contact data. This refers to the estos UCServer user as well as to Federation contacts. estos UCServer will detect the telephone lines for the phone numbers while loading the user profiles. The user will be assigned the phone lines associted with them automatically without further configuration.

Business phone numbers can be selected from the telephone line list via **Select...**.



User phone numbers and line numbersmust be entered in the Supercanonical format in the integrated user administration. Phone numbers from Active Directory® will be shown as entered in the Active Directory®. When user profiles are loaded in estos UCServer, these numbers will be reformatted to supercanonical format.



If more than one location is used, the phone numbers will have to be stored in supercanonical format in Active Directory®.

Property	Description
Business	The user's primary business phone number
Business 2	Other business phone number for the user
Private	The user's private phone number
Mobile	The user's cellphone number. This phone number is used, for example, to set up an automatic call diversion and to send SMS text messages.
Voice mailbox	Phone number of the user's mailbox. The mailbox is the personal answer machine. This phone number is used, for example, to set up an automatic call diversion.
Recording server	The phone number of an external call recording server. This field is only required if an external server is used and not the integrated call recording server. If this field contains a phone number then this number is used for the phone call recording. Without a phone number, the centrally configured number is used.

Via **Additional Lines...** dialog, you can configure additional lines for users and computers. You can provide the following information from that dialog:

Property	Description
First phone	This is the user's personal phone's internal number. A phone can only have one owner. This

	assignment is also used for the offline journal.
Second phone	You can specify a second personal phone for the user here.

# 3.2.7 User settings: services

Here you can configure or view which estos UCServer services and functions the user may use.

Field	Value
Configure user profile personally	If this option is activated the user is allowed to change server-relevant settings.
Start chat	If this option is activated the user may send text messages to other users.
Allow audio chat	If this option is activated, the user is allowed to use audio chat with other users.
Allow audio/video chats	If this option is set, the user may communicate with other users using Audio- and VideoChat.
Accept screen sharing requests	If this option is activated, the user is allowed to accept screen sharing requests from another user.
Initiate screen sharing connection	If this option is activated, the user is allowed share his own screen with other users.

Send SMS	If this option is activated the user may send SMS text messages.
Send missed calls as an e-mail	Is this option is activated, the user receives an e-mail for every missed call. The user decides in the estos ProCall settings whether to use this option.
Send missed calls as SMS text	If this option is set, the user can receive SMS notifications about missed calls. The user will decide if they want to use this feature when making the estos ProCall settings.
Record calls	If this option is activated, the user may use the function <i>Record calls</i> .
Use phone books	If this option is activated, the user is allowed to use phonebooks as a contact data source.

## 3.2.8 Groupware connection

Here you can define which product integration is allowed.

#### • Use estos ProCall with Outlook®

The client will connect to an Outlook/Exchange installation if this checkbox is checked MAPI and/or Exchange Web Services (EWS) can connect with Outlook® or Exchange. If Outlook® is used, check the **Use estos ProCall Plug-in with Microsoft Outlook®** checkbox to activate estos ProCall Plug-in for Outlook®. With this option enabled, an additional toolbar will be added to Outlook®, which provides access to some estos ProCall functions in a context sensitive manner. See Integrating Microsoft® Outlook/Exchange for more information.

#### Connect to Microsoft® Echange directly

estos ProCall can also connect to Exchange Servers directly by using Exchange Web Services. The necessary configuration can be read by estos ProCall from Outlook® directly. Mailboxes configured there will be used automatically.

Additionally, mailboxes can be added manually by using the 'Configure' button, e.g. when no Outlook® is installed.



Only Exchange mailboxes from Outlook® can be used automatically, but no POP3 or IMAP mailboxes.



Exchange Web Services requires .NET Framework v4.o or newer.

#### Use estos ProCall with IBM Notes®

Setting this option permits the client to use the functions and databases of an installed and set-up IBM Notes® Client.

Depending on the IBM Notes® installation, it may be necessary to manually set the path to the file *notes.ini*. Tick the box before the input line and give the complete path to the file.

#### • Use estos ProCall with Tobit® David

If a Tobit® David Client is installed on the computer, integration is made possible by setting this option.

## **Professional applications**

Integration with special applications will be offered from this section.

#### • Use DATEV with estos ProCall

If DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro has been installed and setup with Telefonie Pro on the computer, integration will be enabled by setting this option. In this case contacts from DATEV databases will be preferred automatically during the initial installation. This can be changed by the user in the database settings.

## Use Windows® 10 Apps integration

On a computer with Windows® 10, it is possible to integrate the included Mail, Calendar, and Contacts apps into estos ProCall. This option will not be shown on older Windows® versions.

## 3.2.9 Exchange Web Services

#### Profile dialog

This dialog shows all configures mailboxes. Mailboxes can be added or removed here, and the default mailbox can be selected.

Mailboxes read from Outlook® will be shown greyed-out and cannot be removed.

#### • Default mailbox

In this mailbox tasks will be saved (if wanted), and appointments used to create a presence state.

## • Use EWS only (deactivate MAPI)

Deactivates the MAPI-interface. Without this checkbox, MAPI and EWS will be used at the same time.

#### • Monitor Outlook® inbox with EWS

With this setting estos ProCall watches the default mailbox and shows unread mails.

#### Add mailbox dialog

estos ProCall can log on to an Exchange-Server with your Windows® credentials or using usename and password.

The necessary Exchange Web Services URL can usually detected automatically, and you only have to enter your e-mail address.

#### Email Address

The e-mail address of the mailbox that should be added.

#### Server URI

The Exchange Web Services URL which should be used.

This is usually similar to 'https://yourserver.domain/EWS/Exchange.amsx'

#### • Detect server URL automatically

This URL can usually be detected by estos ProCall automatically.

If this is not possible, you can disable the auto detection and enter the URL manually.

#### Use Windows® Login

If it is possible to authenticate against the Exchange Server by using your domain credentials, this option should be set.

Otherwise, estos ProCall will ask for an username and password.

## 3.2.10 Start options

Here you can define, when the estos ProCall will be started.

#### Start estos ProCall with Windows® logon.

If this option is selected, estos ProCall will start when the user logs on to the computer. This option can also be changed in the settings of the program itself.

#### Start estos ProCall now

With this option, estos ProCall will start for initial use immediately after installation has completed.

## 4 Usage of existing contact data

Contact data from other programs can be implemented or searched for. estos ProCall functions can be used from Microsoft Outlook® and Microsoft® Exchange. More information about supported contact data sources can be found on the following pages.

- Supported data sources
- Data from IBM Notes® (was: Lotus® Notes)
- Data from Tobit® David InfoCenter
- Cooperation with Microsoft® Outlook/Exchange

## 4.1 Supported data sources

Contact data source integration is an integral part of estos ProCall. Based on contact data, estos ProCall offers you an extensive catalogue of functions which ideally support you in your work.

In estos ProCall numerous contact data sources can be linked:

#### estos ProCall User

This estos UCServer provided data source gives you access to all user, who are using estos ProCall on the same estos UCServer along with you. As a rule, these are your work colleagues who also use estos ProCall.

#### Lines

This data source is also managed by estos UCServer by your administrator and gives you access to all available phone lines in your phone system.

#### • estos ProCall Favorites

The data source Favorites gives you quick access to all the contacts you have stored in your favorites.

#### Outlook®

With estos ProCall, you can use all contact data stored in your Outlook® client. Thereby, you may choose to only use individual contact folders or all contact folders for an Outlook® inbox. You can also choose to include public contact folders, if your Exchange system provides them and you have access to them.

#### • Exchange Web Services

In addition to Outlook®, data can also be used directly from an Exchange server through its web service (as of Exchange Server 2007). Office 365 can also be integrated using this option, naturally.

#### • IBM Notes®

You can use all IBM Notes® (= formerly Lotus® Notes) address books in estos ProCall. Both the local address book and address books on a Domino server can be directly connected and contacts stored in them can be used.

#### • Tobit® David InfoCenter

Contacts from the Tobit® David InfoCenter can be used in estos ProCall in interaction with estos MetaDirectory. The integration permits existing contacts to be opened and new contacts to be created in the InfoCenter.

#### • LDAP data sources

With the option of connecting LDAP data sources estos ProCall makes a powerful interface available for accessing various contact data stocks provided they offer an LDAP interface themselves.

#### • estos MetaDirectory

The estos MetaDirectory can be integrated into estos ProCall as a special case of an LDAP data source. In this way you can integrate data sources such as IBM Notes®, Tobit® David InfoCenter or common ODBC data sources into estos ProCall. Further information can be found in the estos MetaDirectory help file.

## • Phone books

estos ProCall permits the integration of phone books. At the moment, data from "Das Telefonbuch Deutschland", "Herold Austria" as well as "TwixTel Switzerland" can be directly accessed from estos ProCall. You can also use KlickTel Server in connection with estos MetaDirectory.

Information about the integration, configuration and use of contact data sources can be found under data sources.

## 4.2 Data from IBM Notes®

IBM Notes® address books can be integrated into estos ProCall as contact data sources. Apart from local address books, address books on a IBM® Domino server can also be used.

The integration allows contacts to be edited and opened directly in IBM Notes® from within estos ProCall. New contacts can equally be created in IBM Notes® via estos ProCall. Please bear in mind, however, that the functions for editing and creating contacts are only available if IBM Notes® is running.

Dialing phone numbers from within IBM Notes® using estos ProCall can be realized with scripts.



If a password is required for access to a IBM Notes® address book this must be entered when estos ProCall is started. Optionally, the password can also be saved in estos ProCall.

Information about the integration, configuration and use of contact data sources can be found under data sources.

## 4.3 Data from Tobit® David InfoCenter

Contacts stored in Tobit® David InfoCenter can be used in estos ProCall. estos MetaDirectory must be used for seraching for contacts.

Integration permits contacts to be opened for editing or to be created in the InfoCenter directly from within estos ProCall.

In collaboration with estos ProCall, a phone call can be initiated by clicking a contact's phone number field in the InfoCenter.

Information about the integration, configuration and use of contact data sources can be found under data sources.

## 4.4 Cooperation with Microsoft® Outlook/Exchange

estos ProCall works closely with Microsoft Outlook®. This cooperation is based on two components:

#### Joint data usage

estos ProCall uses the MAPI interface for accessing information from Outlook® or providing new information to Outlook®.

Alternatively, an Exchange Server can be integrated directly by using Exchange Web Services.

#### • Outlook® user interface toolbar

In order to be able to use estos ProCall functions from Outlook®, a COM add-in can be installed upon request, which will add a toolbar to the Outlook® user interface for quick access.

## 4.4.1 Joint data usage

#### Contacts

Contact information from the Outlook/Exchange database can be sought and displayed by estos ProCall. Contacts from other data sources can be comfortably created in the Outlook/Exchange database via estos ProCall so that they are also available there.

#### E-mail

estos ProCall can store missed calls as email in the Outlook® inbox. Upon request, the client will also show the number of new emails in the inbox.

#### Calendar

estos ProCall can use Outlook/Exchange calendar information to determine the user's presence status. The user can define whether private appointments should be included and also prevent access to this information.

#### Tasks

The Outlook/Exchange task database can be used for comfortable call scheduling in estos ProCall.

#### Journal

The Outlook/Exchange journal can be used to save a call journal created by estos ProCall. Copies of the estos UCServer journal entries are made for this purpose in this journal either by mouse click or automatically. It is also possible to define under which conditions such an entry should be copied.

#### **Exchange Web Services**

Should Exchange Server have been integrated directly through Exchange Web Services, estos ProCall will also be able to read the necessary configuration directly from Outlook®. All mailboxes setup there will be checked and used automatically.

## 4.4.2 estos ProCall Plug-in for Outlook®

To make context-sensitive access to estos ProCall features directly from Microsoft Outlook®, installation will add a plug-in-toolbar to Outlook®. Making calls, searching for contacts and creating tasks will be made possible by this plug-in.

#### Installation

The toolbar is set up as part of the estos ProCall installation.

#### **Functions**

The toolbar consists of three buttons and one input field:

## 5.1 Program start and overview

You can find out how to start or stop estos ProCall and become familiar with the programs' user interface from here. Please choose a subject.

#### 5.1.1 estos ProCall start and shut down

#### Start

As configured during the basic configuration (start options), estos ProCall should automatically start with Windows®. This can also be set afterwards via the estos ProCall My Computer settings in the Windows®-start menu.

estos ProCall can be started manually at any time by the Windows®-start menu.

#### Exit

estos ProCall will be closed by **Close** item on the main menu or the corresponding entry on the context menu for the tray icon.

#### 5.1.2 Login account

In the dialog "login account" the user account can be configured in order to log onto the estos UCServer.

#### 5.1.2.1 Configure UCServer

If the server configuration was not specified for all users during the estos ProCall installation or via the group guidelines, the estos UCServer can be changed (which the estos ProCall connects to) via the dialog "Login account".

## Configure automatically

If the system administrator configured a DNS Service Location Record for the estos UCServer, the estos UCServer can be automatically located and configured.

#### Search server

All available estos UCServer's in the network can be localized and placed into the input field for the server name with the dialog "Search server".

## 5.1.2.2 Configure User account

Enter here the user name and the corresponding password to log on to the estos UCServer.


#### Use Windows® Login

If the system administrator activated the estos UCServer authentication via the Windows® domain, it is alternatively possible to use the Windows® login.

#### 5.1.3 Main window

The main window estos ProCall gives you access to the functions supporting your everyday work.

The significant sections of the main window will be described by the following material.



- [1] My own presence
- [2] Search input
- [3] Tabs for Contact Search, Favorites, Journal, missed and planned calls

#### 5.1.3.1 My presence

The **My Presence** section will show you the most important information about your presence, the status of your phone lines and audio/video device and your upcoming appointments. In addition to these visualizations you can change your presence state, forward phone calls and access your calendar. For information about your own presence, see the the **My Presence** section.

## 5.1.3.2 Main menu

The main menu can be opened with the main menu button w which is situated in the top right corner.

It has features which will support you in your daily routine or with which you can adjust estos ProCall to your personal needs.

## • **Display monitor**

Click here to start and display the Monitor. You can store important contacts for quick access in the monitor and order them in groups and sub-groups.

#### 

This menu item will open the Journal Browser. In contrast with the Journal Tab on the main window, you will be able to track all available journal entries.

#### • S Chat history

This menu item will open the Chat History in order to review your chat sessions with other other estos ProCall users.

## ■ Inbox

This entry opens Outlook® to show you your inbox.

## Settings

Click here to open the Settings. Here you can define or change the most important estos ProCall settings.

Opens this online help

#### ① About ProCall

Here you get information about the product version of estos ProCall and you have the possibility to get more detailled support informations and log files.

## 5.1.3.3 Search input line

You can use the search input at any time to quickly find your contacts or to simply dial a number. You can immediately re-use the contacts found in the Search tab or save them in the Favourites tab or the Monitor for later use.

## 5.1.3.4 Tabs

The following tabs can be put in the foreground:

- Contact search
  - Lists the hits for a contact search
- Favorites
  - Space for your most important contacts and speed-dial keys
- Journal
  - Collects the last calls made and received
- Unprocessed
  - Saves the incoming calls and chats which you did not answer
- Planned
  - Saves the planned calls

## 5.1.4 Menu bar icon

The symbol in the notification area always gives you a fast access to the estos ProCall main windows. Just left click on the symbol.

During a call, you can always move the Conversation Window into the foreground. If a conversation window is not open or all conversation windows have been displayed, the main window will be shown. Furthermore, your current Presence Status will be shown on the tray icon.

In contrast, if you right-click on the tray icon, you will have access to the following features from the context menu:

## • Presence Profile

The Presence Profiles menu will display all configured presence profiles and allow quick changes to your own presence. In addition, a presence status that was potentially changed manually can be reset using the Restore Status option. For more information, see Your Own Presence.

## Display monitor

Use this function to start the Monitor. If the monitor is already running but currently hidden it is brought into the foreground with this command.

## • **C** Journal browser

You can open the Journal browser with this menu item. Unlike the Journal tab in the main window you can consult all available journal entries here.

## 

Here you can open the Chat history in order to consult your calls to other estos ProCall users.

#### Inbox

The Inbox function switches to Outlook®. You can thus keep an overview of your e-mails received.

## Settings

Open the estos ProCall withSettings in which you can adapt estos ProCall to your requirements.

## Superior Superior

The dialog "Login account" let you inspect the current server connection or log in to estos UCServer under a different user account.

## 5.1.5 Speech bubble info

The info dialog is a small window at the edge of the screen, which will provide information about missed calls, new email messages, new chats and scheduled calls.

If you have missed a call or received a new email, for example, the info dialog will be always displayed. Thus, you will immediately be able to see all of the important information at a glance. You can also change to the relevant view immediately if you click on the desired field:

Field	Function
Missed calls	This opens the Unprocessed tab in the main window. You can therefore see your missed calls at a glance.
E-mails	Click the e-mail field to open Outlook's Inbox and view your new e-mails.
Chats	Click the chat field to open the unedited. If there is one single unedited message the window Message is opened directly for a reply.
Planned	Click the field with the planned calls to display the main window with the Call planning. You will find all planned calls here.

You can also close the informational speech bubble window either by clicking on the Close icon at the top left of the window or by deactivating the corresponding option on the Behavior tab on the Settings dialog.

#### 5.2 Manage contacts

Here you can find out how to find contact details for a person in your database and how to organize this data. Please, choose a subject:



#### 5.2.1 Search contacts

#### 5.2.1.1 Search with input line

The connected data sources are browsed via the search input line. The contacts found will appear on the **Search** tab and can be immediately used for your work or, for example, dragged to the Favorites list for later use.



[3] Extended search / last search terms

You can use the search input with four different search variants:

#### Name search

The name search is the default search case. All contacts with the specified search term in the **last** name, first name, company name and display name fields (insofar as they exist) are sought. For some data sources, such as Outlook® or Exchange Web Services, additional entries for name searches can be indicated using the Datasources tab.

#### • Phone number search

A phone number search instead of a name search is started as soon as you enter a search term in the search input field which estos ProCall can interpret as dialable. All contacts are found who have the searched phone number in a phone number field.

## • Search by e-mail address

A search across all e-mail fields is started if estos ProCall recognises the search term as an e-mail address. All contacts are found who have the specified e-mail address.

#### Detail search

With help of the detail search you can search for terms in dedicated fields. For example you can search for all contacts with name "estos" in the city "Starnberg".

The detail search uses a syntax where all search terms are seperated by comma. The position of the term in the line of commas determines the field where this term is search for.

Default order of the fields is *Name,First name,Company,Zip code,City,Street,Phone number*. The Fields can be configured in the settings at Search parameters.

## Detail search example

- You are searching for contact "Anna Meier". Enter the last name in the first position and the first name in the second position. The searchentry is "Meier, Anna".
- You are searching for contact "Anna Meier". The town and the postcode are in fourth
  position. The company name is left empty as this is not known. The search input therefore
  reads "Meier, Anna, Starnberg".
- O You can also use the postcode (Starnberg's postcode is "82319"). The search input then reads "Meier, Anna,, 82319" or "Meier, Anna,, 82319 Starnberg".
- You are looking for contact "Meier" in "Munich Street". The street is in fifth position. The town is not known and is therefore left empty this time. The search input reads

- "Meier,,,,,Munich". Please note that, as with all other search terms, the street name does not have to be written out in full.
- You are looking for contact "Meier" with the phone number "08151123456" (Germany). The search input for this reads "Meier,,,,,,08151123456".

#### • Advanced search entry

The advanced search is started via the arrow symbol at the end of the search line. It is helpful for users who do not want to use the comma syntax while searching. When entering the search criteria the appropriate comma syntax is entered automatically in the search field.

#### 5.2.1.2 Search tab

The search results are received on the **Search** tab if a new search has been started by entering the search criteria in the search field.

All available functions for the selected contact are displayed in the context menu. The contact menu appears if you click a contact with the right mouse button. Alternatively you can also press the context menu button or the Enter key on the contact.

Some functions which can be used on contacts will be highlighted as links on the shown contact. So if you want to call the contact, just move your mouse over the phone number and left click it. The following table lists all such available functions.

Display name	Opens the Contact details for the contact. Alternatively, you can open the contact with a double click.
	Press the CTRL key at the same time (when possible) to open and edit the contact.

Website	Opens the Web browser with the Internet address which was stored in the contact.

The presence symbol gives you the actual presence state of the found person. You can get all available presence informations about this contact in the tooltip by moving the mouse cursor over this presence symbol.

The search result list can be alternatively arranged with data source, display name, surname or company. The grouping lines can be shown or hidden. Settings can be changed in the context menu which can be accessed by a right click on the row header.

The contacts found can be sorted in ascending (A-Z) or descending (Z-A) order. Click to change the sequence on the column header where it is displayed.

The results list allows the selection of several contacts. Keep the CONTROL key pressed while selecting individual contacts with the mouse. These selected contacts can be dragged into the register card **Favorites** or functions may be carried out that are available for all contacts. That way, for example, you can write an e-mail to several recipients. So it is possible to write emails with more than one recipients for example.

The search result list also allows the selection and copying of single contact fields for the chosen contact. If it contains a action link, move the mouse cursor over the appropriate contact field or a little bit to the left or right beside it. As soon as the mouse cursor changes and indicates a text choice, you can select by holding down the mouse key and pulling the contact fields.

estos ProCall supports two different views in the results list

- 1. Only the details of the last selected contact will be displayed by default. All other contacts will only show with the most important entries, such as like Name, Company,, Presence and Data Source.
- 2. Alternatively, you can also display the contact details in the lower area of the search list. For this, pull the divider at the lower edge of the search list upwards with the mouse. You can remove the contact details area again by arranging the divider at the lower edge of the window. You can also move the divider with the CTRL+G key combination. Now use the arrow keys to change the new size of the detail area upwards or downwards. You confirm your input with the Enter key and cancel it with the ESC key.



The indicated contact fields and the click actions on the contact fields can be individually adapted in the settings under Search result.

#### 5.2.2 Contact details

The contact details window contains all available informations and functions for the contact in question. You may open it with the entry **Open contact details...** in the context menu of the contact or by double click on the contact.

All functions available for the contact are to be found in the icon bar at the upper edge of the window:

Make call

You can dial every phone number of a contact. The numbers are categorized with symbols:

- o Business phone number
- Mobile phone number
- Services software
- Further phone numbers

## • 6 Plan call

Use this function if you want to call the contact later. Planned calls will be restored at estos ProCall after a restart of the client.

## • G Prepare call

This function permits you to prepare a call. Prepared calls are created directly before a call and permit you to select special parameters such as project parameters etc. before the call is connected.

#### Start a Chat with the contact.

This function allows you to start a text based chat.

#### Start an AudioChat with the contact.

Start an AudioChat with the contact. The icon is inactive or grey if the related contact doesn't offer the feature, if no Audio devices are available or if the feature is deactivated.

## Start a VideoChat with the contact.

Start a VideoChat with the contact. The icon is inactive or grey if the related contact doesn't offer the feature, if no Video and Audio devices are available or if the feature is deactivated.

#### Share screen

Pressing the Share Screen button will allow a local screen to be shared with a remote contact, if the rights have been granted by the administrator.

## Request Screen Sharing

Would you like to see another user's screen, you can also request to share the screen by clicking Request Screen Sharing. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator.

## Edit contact

With this function you can open the contact in its original source. For example the contact will open in the contact editor of Outlook® if its data source is Outlook®. Please keep in mind that this function is only available if the contact source is Outlook®, IBM Notes® or Tobit® and the according application is installed on the computer.

Exchange Web Services contacts may be edited using either the installed copy of Outlook® or the Outlook® Web app.

## 

Click here if you wish to use the existing contact as a template for a new contact. A typical application is a further contact person in the company.

## Øpen calendar

With the help of this function you can display the opened contact's calendar. Please note that this function is only available for estos ProCall users who are configured on your Exchange system and that the subscriber's calendar must be enabled.

## 

Select this entry to open the contact folder where the contact has been stored. Note that this feature will only be available if the contact originated from Outlook® or Exchange Web Services.

## Mew Outlook® journal entry

Click here to create a new journal entry in Outlook® or on Exchange Server for this contact. Note that estos ProCall no longer be able to open this contact afterwards.

#### E-mail

If you have stored an e-mail address for the contact this function opens the e-mail editor with the recipient's address already filled in.

#### Website

If you have specified a Web site for the contact this function opens the browser and loads the relevant Web site.

## Clipboard

This function copies all contact detail information to the clipboard. This information can thus also be used in other applications.

#### Wang

Call up this function to show the location of the contact on a map in the web browser. To this end, the

map service stored in estos ProCall is used. Please note that a full address is required for this function in the contact.

#### Transport

Call this function to display a route to the contact's location in the Web browser. The map service set up in estos ProCall is used for this. Please note that you must have configured your own address in the Location settings. The contact must also have an address.

#### 5.2.2.1 Overview tab

The tab **Overview** will show all informations about a contact which were stored. Here you can see all phone numbers, all addresses or the note for example.

Some entries are clickable like links. So you can just click on a phone number to call the contact for example, or send an email by clicking on the email address.

The tab **Overview** is generated using the template file *contact.xslt*, which can be adopted to your needs. For more information about adopting it see Dialog adaptation with Templates.

## 5.2.2.2 Journal tab

In the **Journal** tab all phone calls made with a contact can be found.

This inpersonated journal is mostly the same view as in the tab Journal in the main window.

#### 5.2.2.3 Unprocessed tab

The **unprocessed** tab shows all entries marked as not dealt with or not read, which relate to the contact opened.

Please note that this inpersonated view is always grouped by days beacause grouping by contact does not make sense here. This is in contrast to the unprocessed tab in the main window.

### 5.2.2.4 Planned tab

The **Planned** tab contains all planned calls you have stored for the opened contact. This inpersonated view is the same as the Planned tab in the main window according to all other functions.

#### 5.2.3 Telephone number formats

## 5.2.3.1 Supercanonical number

... makes it possible to distinctivly indentify a caller. estos UCServer and estos ProCall do exclusive use this format internally for all phone numbers. For display the numbers can view reformated in a beautified form. Phone actions will be performed with the shortened version.

Supercanonical phone numbers are starting always with a '+' character and have the following format:

#### +Country Area Number.

No whitespace characters are used. The number consists only of numerics and the '+' character.

Example: +4901234567

## 5.2.3.2 Service numbers

... are official phone number which cannot be given in an international format. For example the german emergency number (110) or the directory assistence (118xx). To dial such numbers with the PC, they have to be longer than the internal numbers or they have to be configured as a rule for external numbers. These numbers will be given directly as dialable without any whitespaces.

Example: 11833

#### 5.2.4 Authorizations

The display of information to a contact in the favorites depends on who is allowed to see the information of the user. To control this, *permissions* are necessary.

Additionally to the visibility the authorizations defines the availability of contact related functions which are accessible for the user throu the *ActiveContacts* 

#### 5.2.4.1 Granting authorizations

Each user can give other users or contact, who are connected to the system via federation, authorizations on the own contact or phone lines. These authorizations are strongly additive to already given adminitrative rights. You cannot remove already given rights.

Permissions can be set via the context menu of the Active Contacts (in favorites), Permissions.

Autorizations apply to contact data of the user and to dynamic informations and functions, which are provided by the estos UCServer. The authorizations on the contact have a fixed definition.

## 5.2.4.2 Authorization inquiry dialog

When a user adds a contact to his favorites, and the user has no permissions at this contact, the contact is (the person) prompted with a permission request to grant appropriate permissions.

The dialog shows a list with the current authorization inquiries. Every line contains the name and/or the identity of the contact requesting authorization. One or several contacts can be selected from the list.

Below the list is a drop down menu where the authorization level can be selected. The authorizations are applied for the selected contacts via a click on **Apply**. These contacts are then immediately placed in the first contact group in Favorites on the main window.

It can be determined that selected contacts will receive no presence information with **Reject**. This corresponds to the authorization level "Blocked". This definition is applied immediately but the contacts do not appear in Favorites.

If a contact that has been locked, should have more permissions, so you have to "Add Contact ..." to the favorite with his identity first.

The allocation of authorizations can also be carried out via the context menu which can be displayed by right clicking on contacts.

Close closes the authorization allocations dialog.

## 5.2.4.3 Change authorization levels

The Favorites will be able to view and change the authorizations once granted by simply using the context menu under **Authorization Level**.

#### 5.2.4.4 Remove authorizations

To revoke authorizations from a contact, this is also done in the context menu with the option **Blocked**. Thereby the contact receives no status updates or other information like names or e-mail addresses.

If a contact from your favorites will be completely deleted, you can decide if you want to *block* this contact. If this is not desired, the authorization level is completely reset, so that this contact can start a new authorization request.

## 5.2.4.5 Table of user and contact authorizations

The authorizations which can be given to other users are differentiated in 5 levels:

- Blocked:
  - Blocked contacts see only your name and your e-mail address and no further information about yourself.
- Public:
  - Public contacts see your name, title, company and e-mail address.
- Business
  - Business contacts will see certain contact information and also restricted information about your availability.
- Team:
  - Team colleagues see detailed contact information and differentiated presence information including notes.
- Personal:
  - Personal contacts see detailed contact- and presence information, inclusive a note ans private data.

Die Berechtigungsstufen schränken ausschließlich die über Präsenzinformationen ausgetauschten Kontaktdaten ein, also in erster Linie Präsenzinformationen, die über Federation übertragen werden. In estos UCServer further information and functions are available to give authorizations to a contact. The following definition is valid for standard authorization levels:




(\*) These authorizations only apply within the estos UCServer service responsible for the user. Federation contacts or contacts from other estos UCServer services will not see this data!

## 5.2.4.6 Administratively pre-set authorizations and authorization levels

The administrator is able to allocate authorization levels or single authorizations. In this case, the administratively pre-set authorization levels cannot be minimized anymore. This means that the lowest authorization level "Blocked" cannot be selected anymore for the contacts concerned. This is because the lowest authorization level allocated by the administrator always applies.





## 5.2.5 Favorites

Frequently used contacts can be stored in estos ProCall in the Monitor. In addition, estos ProCall offers you the option of storing such Active contacts in the main window in the *Favorites* tab.

At the tab *Favorites* the most important contacts can be stored. They can be sorted in free allocatable groups without the need to use the Monitor window. For more information please refer to Monitor and ActiveContacts.

## **Special Favorites tab functions**

The Favorites tab has special features. For example, contacts in the search result list can be added to this tab using the **Add to Favorites** context menu item.

#### Line group

A special group can be dislayed in the Favorites tab which contains all phone lines which your system

administrator has configured for you. You can display this pre-defined line group if you activate the appropriate option in the settings dialog on the View page.

Please note that your Administrator can exclusively change the contents of the group. For you the group is read only. This is by the symbol  $\mathbb R$  in the title bar. If new lines are added or old ones removed, the group is automatically updated accordingly.



If the pre-defined lines do not satisfy your needs you can copy the elements into a new group which you create and then deactivate the pre-defined group in the settings dialog. Please note, however, that this is then no longer automatically updated in case of changes.



Unlike in the monitor, the groups cannot be arranged next to each other in the main window.

#### 5.2.6 Monitor

The estos ProCall monitor is the extended and more flexible version of the contact area in the main window.

The monitor is activated in the **Display monitor** in Main menu. The monitor can be filled with contacts like the Favorites tab in the main window. The different sorts of contacts are described in the section about ActiveContacts.

## 5.2.6.1 Functions in the monitor menu:

The monitor has its own menu. In the docked state it can be opened with the help of the main menu button.

# • KLookup contact

Click here if you are searching for a particular contact. The command opens the estos ProCall main window and automatically sets the input focus in the search input field.

#### «Journal browser

With this menu item in the **Tools** sub-menu, you can open the Journal browser. Unlike the **Journal** tab, you can search all available journal entries here.

## SChat history

Here you can open the Chat history in order to consult your calls to other estos ProCall users.

#### Inbox

The **Inbox** function in the **Tools** sub-menu switches to Outlook®. You can therefore keep an overview of the e-mails you receive.

## • Display in case of call (own line)

Activate this option in the **Characteristics** sub-menu if the monitor is to be displayed for incoming calls.

#### • Display in case of call (all lines)

Activate this option in the **Characteristics** sub-menu if the monitor is to be displayed when a call comes in from a saved contact (or line).

#### • Docked at the edge

Set this setting in the **View**sub-menu if the monitor is to be docked at the edge of the screen as a sidebar. You can also place the monitor next to a different screen edge by picking it up and dragging it to the appropriate position.

#### Always on top

Set this setting in the **View** sub-menu if the monitor is always to be displayed. It can then no longer be covered by other windows.

## • Automatically in the background

Set this setting in the **View** sub-menu if the monitor should automatically 'sleep' when it is not being used. Please note that this option is only available if the monitor has been docked to the side.

#### • Display groups' title bar

Activate this option if the monitor is to display the the groups' title bar.

#### 

Here you get information about the product version of estos ProCall and you have the possibility to get more detailled support informations and log files.

#### • Close monitor

Click here to close the monitor window. You can open it again by using the context menu on the task bar icon or using the menu button in the main window of estos ProCall.

## 5.2.6.2 Arranged in groups:

The estos ProCall monitor offers various possibilities for individual and intuitive grouping of ActiveContacts. So it is possible to group ActiveContacts and to move them around freely by Drag & Drop. Groups will be visualized by tabs in the monitor. So you can picture organisational structures or project teams.

You can arrange groups side by side, one below the other or behind each other. Just right click and hold the button on the title of the group and move it arround to the desired position on the monitor. Positioning arrows which are displayed help you and show you where you can place the groups. Release the mouse button over the positioning arrow which represents the desired position.

#### 5.2.6.3 Functions in the group context menu

Find more options in the econtext menu of the according group. This menu will be displayed via right click on the title of the group or in a free space inside the group.

#### Group

#### o New...

Click here to create a new group. For this you must specify a group name and confirm with "OK".

#### o Rename...

Use this function if you wish to give the group a different name. Confirm the group name with the **OK** button in the dialog window.

#### o Delete..

With this function you can remove an existing group. Please note that this function cannot be undone and all ActiveContacts within the group are also deleted.

#### View

#### No sorting

Select this mode if you want to choose the order of the contacts yourself (use the mouse).

#### Sort by display name

Use this function to sort all ActiveContacts inside the group according their display name. Please keep in mind, that administrative groups, like the line group, cannot be sorted.

## Sort by presence

Unlike display names and numbers the presence status is not color assorted. Rather, each Active Contactis categorized into 3 groups and each category is shown in specified order.

- Online and available
  - This includes following presences: available, busy, do not disturb, inactive
- Offline, but absent
- Not logged in or presence unknown

Thus, each category contains one or more contacts which are sorted alphabetically.

#### Sort by phone number

Run this function to sort all ActiveContacts of this group by their phone number.

#### • Chat with <Group name>...

Click here to start a chat with all contacts of this group.

#### Add contact


This function opens a dialog window with which you can search for contacts and lines. Select the appropriate contacts or lines from the result list which are to be added and confirm you reelection with "OK".

## Add key

Click here to insert a quickdial button in this group. A dialog will appear, where name, phoneline and the number to call should be entered. You may also enter a PBX code to make a special PBX feature available throu this speed-dial key. Close the dialog by clicking on **OK**.

## 5.2.6.4 Visualisation of estos ProCall users on the monitor.

estos ProCall users have a special role on the monitor (and in the tab Favorites). Their availability is displayed with a presence icon. Also displayed are phone number diversions and calendar entries of estos ProCall users. Further information in the segment ActiveContacts.



## 5.2.7 ActiveContacts

Contacts are displayed as ActiveContacts in the Favorites tab.



In addition to ActiveContacts these entries can also be telephone lines and quick dial targets.

## 5.2.7.1 ActiveContacts

ActiveContacts are showing the presence of a contact. Additionly they offer buttons for call establishment, chat capabilities and they grant access to the context menu offering further functions.

The tooltip help of an ActiveContact contains all available information in text format.

A double click on an ActiveContact opens a window showing the related contact details. A right click on an ActiveContact opens the related context menu offering further functions.

Moving the mouse over the ActiveContact buttons displays a tooltip help. A left click on an ActiveContact displays the function buttons listed below:

Icon	Description
4	Call a contact by phone, plan a phone call or prepare a phone call.
(5)	Start a Chat with the contact.
Q	Start an AudioChat with the contact. The icon is inactive or grey if the related contact doesn't offer the feature, if no Audio devices are available or if the feature is deactivated.
	Start a VideoChat with the contact. The icon is inactive or grey if the related contact doesn't offer the feature, if no Video and Audio devices are available or if the feature is deactivated.
•	Futher functions and features are offered at the context menu, e.g. Share screen, Request Screen Sharing, open contact details, save contact details as vCard, tag for status change alerts, change authorisation level and more.
<b>▶</b> Th	ne menu item <b>Authorisation level</b> enables users to change the user rights for the specific contact.

The actual presence of a contact and its services changes dynamically the availablility and status of the related indicators or buttons.

Depending on the existing authorizations for this contact the following icons are displayed:

Icon	Description
Presence	The presence icon displays the contact status.
C	The small phone icon displays a user's line and its status. A phone is displayed for each of the user's visible lines (maximum two). If the line is diverted the phone is complemented with a small arrow.
	The small calendar icon displays the status of the user's calendar if there is an appointment now or in the future (within 24 hours).
M	If a user has not logged in using a Windows® or Mac® client, or if logged in to UCServer using ProCall Mobile while in IDLE mode, an "M" will be displayed as the ActiveContact icon.

### 5.2.7.2 Lines

If the entry represents a phone line the status of a line is displayed. Actions like e.g. setting call diversions are available at the context menu. The actions available are configured centrally by the system administrator. A double click on the entry invokes a phone call.

## 5.2.7.3 Quick dial numbers

The entry can be also defined as quick dial target. The use is of course not just limited to phone calls; user-defined actions on the phone system can also be triggered (e.g. door opener activated by entering the appropriate system code).

### 5.2.8 The Phone-Link

With the installation of estos ProCall on your system the additional URL Handler "phone:" is registered, which allows you to put HTML document references to phone numbers or to the contact details window. A visitor of an Internet site can be given the possibility to initiate a telephone call to a certain participant by clicking on a link, to open the contact detail window or to establish certain contacts in the Favorites.

The use of the URL handler "phone:" for dialing is analogous to "mailto:" within the anchor tag in the HTML code. The number to be dialled or the EntryIDs of the contact to be opened follows as a parameter immediately behind.

## 5.2.8.1 Dial with URL Handler

The phone Handler can easily select a phone number by clicking on a link. For this the phone number to be selected is given to the phone Handler as the only parameter.

### Example:

You wish to create a dialing link for subscriber "John Smith" with phone number "+498912345678". Insert the following lines into your HTML code:

## <a href="phone:+498912345678">call Jon Doe</a>

The example looks like this:

Call John Smith

## 5.2.8.2 Open contact detail window with the URL Handler

The phone Handler can also be used for opening contacts. The Entry-IDs of the contact (separated by ":") must be given to the Phone Handler.

#### Example

You would like to create a link displaying the contact details of the party "John Smith".

For example, the subscriber "John Smith" has the following entry IDs:

Data base ID: DBo6 (ODBC data source)

Data memory ID: ODBC (in case of ODBC: name of ODBC data source)

ContactID: 1 (ID of contact in the ODBC data source)

Add the following lines in your HTML code:

## <a href="phone:ID:DB06:ODBC:1">open John Smith</a>

The example looks like this: Open John Smith



If estos ProCall contains the setting that contacts are opened by default for editing, the contact in the editor of the data source (if possible) is opened instead of the contact detail window.

## 5.2.8.3 Add contact in the URL Handler Favorites

In addition the phone Handler can be used to implement or add contacts to the Favorites or in the estos ProCall monitor. This can be optional contacts from the linked contact data sources or Federation contacts.

To add a contact from a data source, the keyword "addcontact:" must be given after the keyword "phone:". Afterwards, the Entry-IDs of the contact are displayed in the same way as in the contact detail window, each separated with ":". Optionally, the tab and the group name where the contact should be filed, can be given.

Without specifying a tab and group name the contact is stored at the tab "Favorites".
 If only the tab name is given, the contact is put in the first group in the card index tab.
 If only the group name is given, all tabs are searched and the first group of the same name is used.
 If no tab or group with the given name exists, these are automatically applied.

### Example:

You want to include "John Smith" in Favorites. The participant "John Smith" has the same EntryIDs like in the example "open contact detail window".

Add the following lines in your HTML code:

<a href="phone:addcontact:DB06:ODBC:1" > include John Smith in Favorites</a>

The example looks like this: Include John Smith in Favorites

#### Example:

You want to include "John Smith" in the "Support" monitor group.

Add the following lines in your HTML code:

<a href="phone:addcontact:DB06:ODBC:1:support"> include John Smith in the support group</a>

The example looks like this: Include John Smith in the support group

To include a Federation contact, specify the presence identity (e.g., SIP Uri) instead of the Kontakt-EntryIDs.

### Example:

You want to include the Federation contact "John Smith" with the presence identity "john.smith@domain.de" in the "support" monitor group.

Add the following lines in your HTML code:

<a href="phone:addcontact:john.smith@domain.de:support" > include John Smith in the support group</a>

The example looks like this: Include John Smith in the support group

## 5.3 Use presence information


Here you find out how to control and use the presence information. Please, choose a subject:

- Own presence
- The presence of the contacts
- Presence icons

### 5.3.1 Own presence

The **My presence** display in the Main window shows the user's currently set presence information (or the information determined by estos UCServer). Therefore the user can see at any time how they are visible in the system for other users. The user interface visualizes upcoming appointments, status of phones, including set call forwardings and allows access to the settings of estos ProCall.

### 5.3.1.1 My presence



- [1] My own presence
- [2] State / Note
- [3] Current logged in user
- [4] Own lines
- [5] Own Audio/Video devices
- [6] Own calendar
- [7] Main menu

This area consists of several parts (in order from left to right):

#### My presence

The large presence symbol shows you your current presence state (manually set or determind from the estos UCServer). For more information about the symbols and colours used by estos ProCall see Presence symbols. If you click on the presence symbol the menu for presence settings and presence profiles opens.

• Currently logged-in users with status and memo

The two lines of text contain the name of the user who is logged in in the first line and the status in

text form below with the memo just set if present.

If one of the texts is clicked a dialog opens to modify the current presence. The status, the memo and a Diversion profile can be selected in this dialog. These settings are immediately accepted when the "OK" button is clicked.

#### Own line(s)

All phone lines of the user will be shown as symbols. You can find more information about phone lines in Lines options.

## • Own Audio-/Video devices

The item stands for the Audio-/Video devices available for Audio-/VideoChat. The item can be clicked or it can be opened per ALT+V keys to configure the usage of the Audio-/Video devices. Once the item is clicked a menu allows configuring if Audio- and Video devices are to be used (for VideoChat), if Audio devices only are to be used (for AudioChat) or if no devices are to be used (Audio/VideoChat off). The selected configuration can be changed later any time by pressing the AV device item at the My Presence area. Further an Audio-/Video Wizard can be started to store the devices to be used with Audio-/VideoChat. The tooltip on the item gives you a description of the devices you are using. Additionally the color of the item describes the actual status of the devices. If it is "green" all devices are ready to use, "red" for devices are in use and "gray" means that no devices are available. A triangle symbol is used for VideoChat, a headset symbol is used for AudioChat. For more information about Audio/Video communication see Audio-/VideoChat.

### • Own diary

Shows the current diary status and permits opening the diary if available. A tool tip will show the next scheduled appointment. Moreover, you can look into the context menu (right click) and read the diary so as to selectively reconcile your appointments with estos UCServer.

#### Main menu

Opens the estos ProCall main menu.

## 5.3.1.2 Presence settings and presence profiles

This menu can be opened with clicking on the presence symbol and is used to change the own presence state and for configuring of presence profiles.

A presence profile is a combination of a presence state, a note and a forwarding profile. How to configure an own presence profile is described later on in this section.

## Presence entries

The first part of the menu displays the currently available presence profiles. There are four pre-defined profiles, one for each presence status. The menu entry describes precisely what is set on selection.

#### Reset status

With this, the user can reset a manually set presence state. This does not change the memo or set call redirections.

### Set memo...

This menu entry opens a small dialog in which a memo text can be entered. Memo texts which have already been used can be set again with the **History...** button. The text is saved with the **OK** button; **Cancel** closes the dialog without setting the text.

## Delete note

Deletes the memo just set.

## Set presence...

Opens a dialog with which all presence aspects can be set simultaneously. The user can select their status, the memo and a diversion profile here and set them by confirming with **OK**. **Cancel** closes the dialog without making changes to the presence.

## Edit presence profiles...

Opens a dialog which can be used to configure presence profiles.

There are four default profiles, which can't be deleted but adopted to your needs.

The user can also create own additional profiles with the **New** button.

As well **Edit** as **New** open a further dialog which permits all aspects of a profile to be set.

## 5.3.2 The presence of the contacts

Every user connected to the system has his own status, his *Presence*. This information is established according to defined rules from the status of several services: Telephone status (telephone service), calendar status (calendar service), logged on/ logged off (system service) and manually entered user status.

The presence gives information about the current availability of a call partner at any time.

An overview of the displayed presence symbols and their meaning can be found under presence symbols.

## 5.3.3 Presence icons

Every user connected to the system has his own status, his *Presence*. This information is established according to defined rules from the status of several services: Telephone status (telephone service), calendar status (calendar service), logged on/ logged off (system service) and manually entered user status.

The presence therefore dynamically informs of the availability of a communication partner depending on the current status of the various services.

## Possible presence states

Status color	Meaning
	Available
	Busy
-	Out of office
-	Inactive
=	Do not disturb
	Presence information unavailable

In addition to this presence information the following additional icons are used in estos ProCall:

lcon	Meaning
	If a contact is not logged on to a server their status is displayed with a gray symbol.
	If a contact receives a call on one of their lines their status flashes red/orange

i

If a contact has created a memo this is symbolised by a black "i".

Besides to the contact-based presence information the telephone lines shows a different status:

Icon	Meaning

cc	Changing between red and green - incoming ringing

•	Active call redirection
0	Active call protection (the icon for the redirection is not displayed with active call protection).

## 5.4 Plan communication

Here you can find out how to plan and track your communication with estos ProCall. Please choose a subject:

- Journal
- Journal browser
- Journal editor
- Unprocessed calls and chat
- Call planning
- Reminder window
- The chat history

## 5.4.1 Journal

The **Journal** tab in the main window shows the last calls and chats. It contains the most important information in a view. The entries are always grouped by days.

The calls displayed use the same icons on the **Journal** tab as in the journal browser.

- Incoming external calls (connected)
- Incoming external calls (not connected)
- Gutgoing external calls (connected) and calls (not connected)
- Incoming internal calls (connected)
- Gutgoing internal calls (connected) and calls (not connected)
- Section TextChat
- Incoming audio chats (connected)

- Outgoing Audio Chats
- Incoming video chats (connected)
- Incoming missed video chats (not connected)
- Dutgoing video chats

The **Journal** tab can filter the shown entries with various options:

- Today
  - Click here to display just the calls which were made or taken today.
- 🗓 Last week
  - Click here to display just the calls which were made or taken in the last seven days.
- Last month
  - Click here to display just the calls which were made or taken in the last 31 days.

With estos ProCall it is possible to filter journal entries with a freely defined text. For example type '123' into the input field of the filter options to reduce the contents of the view to entries which are containing the text '123'. Please note that using the free text filter in this view only affects the currently loaded data and hides unwanted rows for a quick access. For a complete full text search in the complete database please use the journal browser instead.

In the **Journal** tab you can configure the shown columns. You can reposition a column by left click and hold the left mouse button on the column header. Now move the mouse to the desired position. To remove a column, just move it outside the table. Right click on a column header opens a context menü. There you can change the visibility of columns and you can set the columns and their grouping options back to default. With this context menu you can open the field selection dialog. Here you can drag and drop column headers in to the table to add these columns to the view.

- Unlike the journal browser, the **Journal** tab does not have to be updated manually. New journal entries are entered automatically.
- Unedited calls and chats will be shown in bold.
- Calls which are answered by other users are shown in blue.
- Journal entries can be sorted by clicking on their column headers (reverse ordre it by click again).

  Please note, that journal entries are sorted within their grouping setting (per day).
- Please note that the journal in the main window is only a brief view of the journal entries. You will find a detailed journal with all columns and journal entries in the Journal browser.

## 5.4.2 Journal browser

The journal browser of estos ProCall offers a more detailed view on your calls and chats than the journal tab in the main window. Here you can get all calls of arbitrary time frames and you can group them with differently, not only ba days.

The calls displayed use the same symbols in the Journal browser as in the main window:

- **G** Incoming external calls (connected)
- Incoming external calls (not connected)
- Goutgoing external calls (connected) and calls (not connected)

- Incoming missed internal calls (not connected)
- Gutgoing internal calls (connected) and calls (not connected)
- TextChat
- Incoming audio chats (connected)

- Incoming video chats (connected)
- Incoming missed video chats (not connected)
- Modern State
   Moder

The journal browser has a series of filters with whose help certain calls can be displayed or hidden depending on their type.

#### Some Default

Clicking on this button will reset all type-based filter settings to their default values. All calls that you have made will also be displayed again.

### • **G** Incoming calls

Activate this option to display just incoming calls. Deactivate this option to display both incoming and outgoing calls.

## Goutgoing calls

Activate this option to display just outgoing calls. Deactivate this option to display both incoming and outgoing calls.

### Internal calls

Activate this option to display just incoming calls. Deactivate this option to display both incoming and outgoing calls.

## External calls

Activate this option to display just external calls. Deactivate this option to display both external and internal calls.

## • Calls (not connected)

Activate this option to display just calls which were not connected. This also contains all missed calls. Deactivate this option to display both calls which were connected and calls which were not connected.

## Calls (connected)

Activate this option to display just connected calls. Deactivate this option to display both calls which were connected and calls which were not connected.

#### With note

Activate this option to display just calls for which call memos were saved. Deactivate this option to display both calls with and calls without call memos.

## Without note

Activate this option to display just calls without call memos. Deactivate this option to display both calls with and calls without call memos.

#### • Bhone number hidden

Activate this option to also display phone conversations that block the partner's phone number. Deactivate this option to only display those conversations that provided the partner's phone number.

## Public entries

Activate this option to also display calls by other estos ProCall users. Please note that private calls by other estos ProCall users are not displayed. Equally, the journal entries of other estos ProCall users cannot be changed as a rule. Deactivate this option to only display your own phone calls.

## Filter journal type

Use this feature to filter journal types. By default, all journal types will be odisplayed. Journal type options include: TextChats only, AudioChats only, VideoChats only or ophone calls only.

In addition, estos ProCall supports further functions for finding journal entries:

- **Date filter:** Select the desired start and end date in the date fields in order to display just journal entries from within a certain period. Alternatively you can also use the pre-defined keys **Today**, **Last week** or **Last month** to set the time period.
- **Text filter:** You can filter journal entries by a freely defined text. For example, type in the name of a sought after contact into the text field and press Enter. Alternativly you can start the search by pressing the **Start search** button.

The journal browser has the ability to group journal entries by certain criterias. You can change the grouping option in a drop down box in the area **View**.

- Group by days
  - All journal entries from the same day are grouped together.
- - All the same conversation partner's journal entries are grouped together.
- Group by project
  - All journal entries assigned to the same project are bundled.
- List view
  - The journal entries are displayed without grouping.

### More journal entries

By default, a maximum of 100 hits will be returned from searches by estos ProCall. All additional journal entries corresponding to the search criteria can be requested by clicking the **Additional Journal Entries** button. That button is on the status bar. The button will be hidden when all log entries have been displayed.

The print function in the journal browser enables you to print either everything or only the selected journal entries as a list. It is printed the same as it is displayed on screen, i.e. with the current groupings and all visible columns.

You can freely change the columns to view in the journal browser. You can reposition a column by left click and hold the left mouse button on the column header. Now move the mouse to the desired position. To remove a column, just move it outside the table. Right click on a column header opens a context menü. There you can change the visibility of columns and you can set the columns and their grouping options back to default. With this context menu you can open the field selection dialog. Here you can drag and drop column headers in to the table to add these columns to the view.

- Unlike the **Journal** tab in the main window the journal browser must be updated manually, especially if new journal entries are added.
- Calls and chats marked as Unprocessed are highlighted in bold type.
- Calls which are answered by other users are shown in blue.
- The journal entries can also be sorted if you click the column headers (reverse sorting on second click). If a grouping has been set, the journal entries within each group are sorted according to the sort criterion.
- The grouping after projects is only available when the settings to Projects were configured that should use estos ProCall projects.

## 5.4.3 Journal editor

The journal editor in estos ProCall permits you to look up and subsequently edit information on a call made or received. It can be opened by double click on the journal entry of a journal list for example.

If a contact was linked to the opened journal entry, all functions for the contact can be run via the tool bar. For detailed descriptions of these functions, please refer to Contact details.

In addition, you will find special functions in the icon bar which you can execute for a journal entry:

#### Save

Click here to save all changes to the journal entry.

## Save and close

The journal entry is saved and the editor window is subsequently closed with this function.

#### • 📛 Print

Click here to print out the journal entry.

### Rrint preview

Click here to show a print preview of the journal entry. You can also print the journal entry from the preview.

## Printer settings

Click here if you wish to change the printer settings for printing the journal entry.

#### V Edited

If this button is activated the journal entry is marked as processed. Activate this button if you wish to mark the journal entry as processed.

## Unprocessed

If this button is activated the journal entry is marked as unprocessed. Activate this button if you wish to mark the journal entry as unedited. Unprocessed journal entries are displayed in bold type in the journal view.

The following data in the journal entry can be changed or added to with the journal editor:

## Kalanta Link contact

When the contact selection button is clicked the contact selection dialog opens where you can link the selected contact to the journal entry by clicking **Ok**. Please note that this process transfers both the contact name and also the company name from the selected contact in the journal editor. If a contact is linked to a journal entry, all contact related functions can be executed from within the journal entry. So you can call the contact with a different phone number again or send him an email.

## • Change contact name

You can enter any name in the contact name field which also appears in the journal views. Please note that the contact name can thus deviate from the name of the linked contact.

#### Change company name

You can enter any name to be stored in the journal entry in the company name field. Please note that the company name entered may thus be different from the company name of the linked contact.

### • Change project PIN

You can assign the call to a particular project here. You must first define the projects for this. You can create new projects in the settings under Projects.

## • Mark private call

If this option is activated the call can be marked as a private call. This means that other estos ProCall users can no longer see this entry. Please note that depending on the server settings, all contact data including phone numbers can be shortened or deleted by this.

## • Edit call memo:

Enter your call memo in the journal editor's memo field.



Please note that you cannot change the journal entries of other estos ProCall users.



Please note that the project PIN can only be changed if this feature has been activated in the settings on the Projects page.



It is only possible to mark private calls if this feature has been activated in the settings on the Projects page.

## 5.4.4 Unprocessed calls and chat

You will find phone calls and chats which require your particular attention on the **Unprocessed** tab. Depending on your settings, you will see all journal entries here that are marked as not dealt with or all "Call in absence" email marked "not read". Further information can be found under Settings in the Incoming calls.

You will find the following functions on the **Unprocessed** tab's icon bar:

## Mark as edited

The selected entry or entries are marked as processed or read. The entries thus disappear from the view.

## Mark all as edited

Marks all entries in the view as processed or read. The view is then empty.

#### Internal calls

Activate this option to additionally display internal calls. Deactivate this option to display just external calls.

## • Grouped by days

Click here if the entries in the list are to be grouped by day.

## Grouped by contacts

Click here if the same subscriber's entries in the list are to be grouped.

In this view of estos ProCall it is possible to filter the entries with a freely defined text. For example, if you type in '123' into the input field of the filter options, you will only see entries which contain '123' in one of their fields.

In the tab **Unprocessed** you can freely configure the displayed columns. You can reposition a column by left click and hold the left mouse button on the column header. Now move the mouse to the desired position. To remove a column, just move it outside the table. Right click on a column header opens a context menü. There you can change the visibility of columns and you can set the columns and their grouping options back to default. With this context menu you can open the field selection dialog. Here you can drag and drop column headers in to the table to add these columns to the view.



An overview of the entry icons can be found on the Journal.



The phone calls can also be sorted if you click on the column headings (reverse sorting on second click). If a grouping is defined the phone calls within each group are sorted by the search criterion.

## 5.4.5 Call planning

## 5.4.5.1 Plan call

With the help of the *call planning* window you are able to mark calls which you wish to make in the future. Already planned calls can be viewed in the tab **Planned** in the main window.

You will find all the functions which you can use for a planned call in the editor's icon bar

## Make call

Click the upper half of the button to call the subscriber. The phone number which was specified in the phone number field in the editor dialog is always used.

In the lower half of the push button, you are able to view the contact context menu with the arrow. Here, you will find every activity available for the linked contact. For a detailed description of these functions, please refer to contact details.

#### Save

Click here to save the planned call and all changes. The saved call appears on the tab **planned** in the main window.

#### Save and close

The planned call is saved with this function and the editor window is then closed.

#### Print

Click here to print out the planned call.

## Rrint preview

Click here to display a print preview of the planned call. You can also print out the planned call from the preview.

## Printer settings

Click here if you wish to change the printer settings for printing the planned call.

## • Belete planned call

Click here to delete the planned call. The editor window is then closed. Please note that this action cannot be undone.

## Change the status of the planned call

In the section **Status** on the tool bar, the status of the planned call can be define with the aid of the drop-down box:

## Set to in process.

Select this entry if you wish to show that you are currently processing the planned call.

## Mark as completed

Select this entry if you wish to show that you have successfully processed the planned call.

#### Mark as not started

Select this entry to indicate that the planned call is pending.

## Mark as waiting for someone else

Select this entry if you have to wait for someone before you can make this call.

## Mark as deferred

Select this entry to mark the planned call as postponed.

The following data for the planned call can be defined or changed with the editor:

### • Change subject:

The topic field is generated automatically when creating a new planned call. You can customise this according to your requirements here.

## Kalanta Link contact

Clicking the contact selection button opens the contact selection dialog with which you can link the selected contact to the planned call by confirming with "OK". Please note that both the contact name and also the company name are transferred from the selected contact to the editor by this process.

## • Change contact name

You can enter any name in the contact name field which also appears in the journal views. Please note that the contact name can thus deviate from the name of the linked contact.

#### Change company name

You can enter any name which is to be saved in the journal entry in the company name field. Please note that the company name entered can thus deviate from the name of the linked contact.

#### • Change phone number

The phone number which is dialed when the upper half of the Call button is clicked is shown here. If

you have linked a contact to this planned call you can dial one of the contact's phone numbers in the dropdown list. You can nevertheless also enter any phone number in the field.

#### • Define start date

Enter the start date in the relevant field. This defines when the planned call is to be made. Alternatively you can open a calendar via the dropdown arrow and simply select a day. Note: If neither a due date nor a reminder date have been activated, these will also be entered automatically when selecting the starting date.

#### • Enter date due

Define here by when the planned call should have been made. You can either enter the date directly or use the calendar which you can open via the dropdown arrow.

Note: if you have not yet defined a reminder date this is automaticallly set when the due date is selected.

#### Set reminder

Activate this option and enter the reminder date with a time to be reminded of the call. The Reminder window opens at the given time. Please note that the reminder function is only performed for planned calls which are marked as not processed.

### • Change project PIN

Here you can assign the planned call to a particular project. You must first define the projects for this. You can create new projects in the settings under Projects.

Please note that the project PIN can only be changed if this feature has been activated in the settings on the Projects page.

## • Change memo

Here you can enter a memo text for the planned call which you wish to save.

## 5.4.5.2 Planned calls

The tab **Planned** gives an overview of all phone calls which are planned with estos ProCall.

#### Display of planned calls

The planned calls have different icons depending on the processing status:

## • 👢 In progress

The planned call is presently being processed.

## • 👼 Completed

The planned call has been successfully processed.

## B Not started

Processing of the planned call has not yet begun.

## • 📑 Waiting

Waiting for someone else to process the plannned call.

## Beferred

Processing of the planned call has been postponed.

In addition, the planned call is highlighted differently depending on its status:

- Planned calls which have not yet been processed are shown in bold text
- All planned calls due in the past which have not been completed are highlighted in red.
- Completed planned calls are crossed through and appear light grey.

The view on the "Planned" tab can be customised. Entries which fulfil certain criteria can be shown or blanked out.

## State of the state

Activate this option to also display all planned calls which have neither a date nor a reminder set.

## Sompleted calls

Activate this option to additionally display all calls which have already been marked as completed.

The status of the planned calls can be changed via the icon bar or the context menu. Mark the relevant entries in the list and click the appropriate button.

Set to in process.

Select this entry if you wish to show that you are currently processing the planned call.

Mark as completed

Select this entry if you wish to show that you have successfully processed the planned call.

Mark as not started

Select this entry to indicate that the planned call is pending.

Mark as waiting for someone else

Select this entry if you have to wait for someone before you can make this call.

Mark as deferred

Select this entry to mark the planned call as postponed.

Further functions for processing planned calls are available in the icon bar:

Melete


Select this function to delete the selected entries. Please note that the deleted entries cannot be restored.

• 🔯 Update

Click this button to update the view.

In this view of estos ProCall it is possible to filter the entries with a freely defined text. For example, if you type in '123' into the input field of the filter options, you will only see entries which contain '123' in one of their fields.

In the **planned** tab columns can be freely configured. You can reposition a column by left click and hold the left mouse button on the column header. Now move the mouse to the desired position. To remove a column, just move it outside the table. Right click on a column header opens a context menü. There you can change the visibility of columns and you can set the columns and their grouping options back to default. With this context menu you can open the field selection dialog. Here you can drag and drop column headers in to the table to add these columns to the view.



The planned calls can also be sorted if you click on the column headers (reverse sorting on second click). Please note that the planned calls are sorted within their group, in other words per day.

## 5.4.6 Reminder window

The reminder window reminds you of calls which you have planned. It is always displayed when a reminder for a planned call is shown. The calls are displayed in a list.

Planned calls are highlighted differently in the overview. Details about this can be found in the help file for the call schedule.

You will find the following functions in the icon bar:

### Make call

Click the upper half of the button to call the subscriber. The phone number which was specified in the phone number field of the planned call is always used.

In the lower half of the push button, you can call up the contact context menu with the arrow. Here, you will find any operations available for the contact. For a detailed description of these functions, please refer to Contact detail window

## B Open planned call

Click this button to open the call schedule in the list. Alternatively you can also open a call with a double-click on the list entry.

## Remind later

Use this function to be reminded of the planned call again later. Mark the relevant entries in the list and select the appropriate time period for this.

You can also switch off the reminder for the planned calls. Select **Do not remind again** from the menu for this.

## • Bulete planned call

Use this button to delete the selected planned calls form the list. Please note that this function cannot be undone.

- When you close the reminder window it is first displayed again when a reminder for the next call is due.
- A complete overview of all planned calls can be found in the main window in the "Planned" tab.
- The reminding time can be changed if you open the planned call in the editor. Further information under Planning calls.

## 5.4.7 The chat history

Similar to the Journal browser, the chat history shows an overview of conversations with other users. Various filters show the desired information quick and clearly.

## 5.4.7.1 Edit

- Answer unread chat / continue chat
- Mark chat as read
- Melete chat. Deletes just your part of the chat. The history is not altered for other participants.
- \(\begin{align\*} \left\) Save selected chat as text (unformatted) or rich text (formatted).

## 5.4.7.2 Search criteria

#### Date filter:

Select the desired start and end dates in the date fields in order to display just chat from within a certain period. Alternatively you can also use the pre-defined **Today**, **Last week** or **Last month** keys to adjust the time period.

#### • Text filter:

You can filter chat entries by a freely defined text. For example, type in the name of a sought after contact into the text field and press Enter. Alternativly you can start the search by pressing the **Start search** button.

## 5.4.7.3 View

- Display a preview of the individual chat

- The chat history always shows all unread messages regardless of the filter settings.
- The chat history is automatically opened when you start ProCall when you have new chats, and you have disabled the popup for new chats (see also behavior).
- You can continue any chat you wish. Participants can no longer be added or removed after they have been stored in the history log. (Chats no longer have a moderator)

## 5.5 Communicate


Here you can find out how estos ProCall can support you in your daily work. Please, choose a subject:

- Call window
- Line settings
- Call forwardings
- Remote Office
- Chat, SMS, E-Mail
- Audio/Video conversation window
- Screen Sharing

## 5.5.1 Call window

The call window is the information and control centre for your phone calls. In addition to the visualisation of the call state, dialog partner and other relevant informations about the call, it is also possible to control the call. The window encapsulates logically connected phone calls in a single user interface and thus permits the convenient control of one or more calls on one phone. With the option of making assignments to projects, marking private calls and writing memos, this window is one of estos ProCall's central components.

## 5.5.1.1 Call window overview:



- [1] Call state
- [2] Active line
- [3] List of calls
- [4] Control
- [5] Call Memo / Project settings

The call window, as shown above, is divided vertically into three areas.


- A list of calls

  The call window can manage and control one or more calls or even a conference call. All calls which
  belong together are displayed in a call window.
- Phone control The call control area enables you to control the active call.
- Memo area with project, private labelling, phone number display suppression The memo area extends the phone information and control with a collection of information about the call. The memo entered is written into the journal of all call participants when the window is closed. If finished calls are removed from the call window, the given note is stored at that time. To be able to set projects and mark private calls adds to the information pool. For more information about the project settings and private settings see Projects.

In this area you still have the option of suppressing the display of your phone number by switching on the phone number display suppression. The remote station called then does not see who is calling. (Does not work with every phone system and not with internal calls).

Icon	Meaning

## 5.5.1.2 Overview of the individual call in the call window:



- [1] Call partner
- [2] Contact chooser
- [3] Phone number
- [4] Call duration
- [5] Hide contact details

### Status icon

The status icon shows the current state of the call. A list of status icons used can be found here. Apart from the visualisation, you can open the journal created for he current call participant via the icon. If the window contains several calls you can select a call by means of the icon and call this contact again. A tooltip on the icon displays a brief summary of the most important call information.

### Call partner

estos UCServer and estos ProCall search automatically for a contact for the phone number during a call. The contact found is displayed here if available. If no contact could be found you can create a new contact here.

You can read about which data sources can be searched in which order during a contact search in Contact search. If several contacts are found a button appears next to the contact to enable selection of a contact.

- Contact selection If several contacts are found for the current phone number, you can select a
  particular dialog partner by means of the contact selection. estos ProCall stores this selection and will
  show you this contact as your dialog partner the next time he calls again. Further information about
  searching for contacts in estos UCServer and ProCall can be found under contact search.
- Number The number is displayed next to the status icon. The tooltip always contains the call status and number.
  - You can change the dialog partner's number for a prepared or ended call here. A new contact search is automatically triggered if you change the number.
- Call duration Displays how long you have been connected with the dialog partner.

• Show contact details One of the strengths of estos ProCall is the option of extending the call window with dynamic HTML content. You can show and hide the display of additional information with this button. A series of templates are available for displaying further information which you can adapt to your needs.

The template defines which contact details are to be shown. You will find the templates in the installation directory in *Templates/default/*:


- RemoteContact.xslt
   Is used in the call window for preprocess details for the current dialog partner. The template defines which contact details are displayed.
- HoldContact.xslt
   Is used in the call window to preprocess the details for a dialog partner on hold. The partner on hold is displayed if a further estos ProCall user holds a subscriber while calling you. The template defines which contact details are displayed.
- LocalContact.xslt Is used in the call window to preprocess details for the contact called. In
  case of an incoming call the contact called is displayed if a contact's number is found. For this
  you must activate the hotline services in the settings for incoming calls. The template
  defines which contact details are displayed.
- o RedirectedContact.xslt Is used in the call window to preprocess the contact details for a forwarded call. The contact for whom the call was last signalled is displayed. The template defines which contact details are displayed.

The contact data and call data provided in XML are implemented by the software in the template. If the template data contains data to be displayed, it is shown in the call window (if applicable). In order to make customisation of the call window templates as simple as possible, you can display the XML contact and call data provided and also the result of the XSLT parser. Copy the appropriate template out of the default directory into the template folder, open it and change the value of variable *debug* in the body tag to 1:

## <body minwidth="0" minheight="0" maxwidth="0" maxheight="0" debug="1">

After you have reloaded the contents of the call window by pressing F<sub>5</sub>, the displayed templates appear with a colored background. A context menu permits you to view the source code. The upper part of the text file contains the parsed template; the lower part contains the raw XML data which was handed to the parser. Further information on developing your own XSLT templates can be found here.

## 5.5.1.3 Conference



- [1] Conference controller
- [2] Conference participant
- [3] Controls for the conference

The call window is displayed in the format shown above as soon as you initiate a conference. You can no longer directly control the individual calls but only the conference which is displayed as the uppermost entry in the call list. How long the conference has been running is shown next to the number of conference participants. The further elements of of the call window are similar to those described above.

## 5.5.1.4 The various status icons:

The states of phone calls are visualised by means of various status icons. The icon provides direct access to the journal for the current dialog partner. The tooltip contains information on the state of the current call. If there are several calls in the call window you will always see which is the current live call by the symbolised text in the speech bubble.

Icon	Meaning
Q	Incoming call. Flashes when the phone rings.
3	Outgoing call. Flashes when the phone being called rings.

$\Diamond$	Ended call. If there are several calls in the call window this is the unselected, ended call. When all calls in the call window have ended, you can select this call by clicking it. The selected call is started with the <b>call</b> button.
	If there are several calls in the call window, the text in the speech bubble shows you that this is the active call. This call is displayed with the controls in the lower part of the call window.

## 5.5.1.5 The various control options:

Depending on the telephony status you can perform various control actions on the current call. The visibility of the individual buttons is significantly influenced by the function range of the phone system.

Icon	Meaning
6	Set up dialing for the phone number currently stored in the call window:
6-	The currently selected contact in the call window offers several numbers. Via the icon <b>select</b> you can choose another of the contact's phone numbers. The call is not yet initiated. The icon <b>call</b> starts the call.
æ	Accept an incoming call. The phone switches to hands-free mode. Analogue phones do not support this feature.
G	End current call. Reject incoming ringing call. End consultation call End conference. End auto-dial.
G	The current phone status either permits ending various calls or you can connect subscribers to each other by hanging up. The combo menu displays which actions are supported. The <b>hang-up</b> key ends the current call.
6	Hold current caller. The subscriber is either put on hold or a callback is initiated depending on the phone system.
G	Retrieve subscriber on hold

6,	Begin callback. A window opens for searching for contacts or entering numbers. The window contains the last targets for callbacks and forwardings.
€0	Call on hold. Current call participant is on hold and call participant which was on hold gets connected.
¢	Initiate conference. Initiate a conference with the current dialog partner and the dialog partner on hold.
G.	Add dialog partner to the conference being held.
G	Forward call. A window opens for searching for contacts or entering numbers. The window contains the last targets for callbacks and forwardings.
•	Forward call. You have access to your contact's further phone numbers via the check box. Thus, you can quickly forward a call on your cordless or mobile phone. <b>The Forward</b> button opens the contact dialog as described under <i>Forwarding</i> .
G.	If the number called is engaged you can start automatic redialing via this icon. An attempt is made to call the subscriber again after a certain period of time. At what intervals and how often this redialing should take place can be defined in the settings Outgoing calls define.
æ	Activates the Callback when no answer or engaged function. A callback to this subscriber is started as soon as the remote station is available again.
6	Planning a new call to the current contact's last connected number. If the select button is visible, you can choose one of the contact's other phone numbers for the planned call.
<b>6</b> *	The current call will be restored to the planned status e.g. for setting other project settings. If the select button appears, you can choose other phone numbers of the contact for planing the call.
•	Begin call recording. If call recording is set up on the server, you can thus start call recording which is sent to you as an e-mail after the end of the call. This is possible both with a dialog partner and a conference.
•	End current call recording.
***	Opens a dialog for subsequent selection of DTMF tones. Input can be made with both the keyboard and the mouse.
	various buttons are not visible either the current phone status or the phone system driver do not rmit this action.

## 5.5.2 Line settings

All lines assigned to the user or computer are indicated as icons in My Presence. These change color in accordance with the telephone status of the line. Many different operations can be carried out on this line via the menus opened with a click.

## 5.5.2.1 Entries in the line menu:

#### • Set as default line

If a user has more than one line, he can define via the menu which one is to be the standard line. All telephone operations not requiring specification of the user's own line relate to this line. The line is shown in bold typre.

## • Telephony control

If a line is busy with a call, you can only have a controlling influence on the call on this line. No other operations are offered.

#### • Set call diversion...

Permits direct set-up of call diversion without having to configure a Call diversion profile. The last call diversion is saved and automatically recorded in the last dialog.

#### • Cancel call diversion

Shows all items of call diversion set up on this line. If the call diversion set up can be attributed to a Call diversion profile, the name of the profile is displayed.

## • Set call forwarding

Shows all configured Call diversion profiles currently set up on the line.

## Switch protection against incoming calls on/off

Permits activating or deactivating protection against incoming calls on the line.

#### • Remote Office

Redirects the extension to a phone outside of the company. Outgoing calls will display the company's number. Further details can be found under Remote Office.

## • Configured feature codes

If feature codes for your telephone system were configured on the estos UCServer these will be displayed here.

### • Activate/deactivate suppression of phone numbers

This allows you to activate or deactivate caller ID suppression for outgoing calls on the line. You will see in the menu whether caller ID is displayed or suppressed. You must activate the caller ID suppression feature in the Settings.

## • Extended settings

## o Configure call forwardings...

Allows configuration of Call diversion profiles.

### Rename line...

Here, you can change the name for the line. That way, it is easier to distinguish between different terminals using the same phone number.

## 5.5.3 Call forwardings

Call diversions can be set in several contexts in estos ProCall.

Call diversion profiles have been integrated to support the User in being able to reuse several different oftenused call diversions and at the same time to be able to divert several lines.

If a call diversion is to be set on one of your own lines this can be done via the lines button in the "My presence" area.

This opens a dialog which lists the currently available call diversions and allows them to be reset or edited.

A call diversion profle consists of a name, the line which is to be diverted (or the lines which are to be diverted), the type of diversion and the target phone number.

#### New

With **New** a new call diversion profile can be established. This opens a dialog. In this dialog, the user defines the name of the profile and selects the line to be forwarded. He can also select **All** if he has several lines and wishes to forward calls from all of them.

#### Edit

The currently selected diversion profile can be edited with this icon.

#### Delete

Deletes the selected profile.

## 5.5.4 Remote Office

The Remote Office feature makes working while on the road or at home possible. With this function, your phone number can be redirected to any phone desired (the Remote Office Phone).

This feature can be turned on and off from Line Settings. If the feature is not visible there, the telephone system does not support it.

If the feature 'Remote Office' is turned on, the behavior will change as follows:

- Calls to your phone will be forwarded to the Remote Office phone.
- If the PC is used to select phone number, the Remote Office Phone will ring first. If the call is answered, you will be connected with the selected phone number.

## 5.5.5 Chat, SMS, E-Mail

The message system in estos ProCall allows conversations (Chat) between two and up to 30 participants. If individual users are not logged in while the conversation is ongoing, they are shown all conversations after logging in. Participants can be added to or removed from the conversation at any time. A message history displays an overview of conversations held. Links written, e-mail numbers, etc. are highlighted accordingly and support you in your daily work.

## 5.5.5.1 Start chat

There are various ways of initiating a chat.

## Schat to a single user:

Everywhere you see another user or contact in estos ProCall you can begin a chat with this user via the context menu or via the ActiveContacts icons. This is possible in any presence state of the contact. In the presence state *Do Not Disturb (DND)* the message may be delivered later. If the Chat icon is clicked the **Chat window** opens. At the text field the message can be entered. Once finished the icon *Send* can be pressed. By pressing the *Smiley* button, a smiley from the Smilies list and added to the message. The message sent and the message received by remote users will be displayed with contact name and time stamp in the upper text chat message window. If either Audio- or Video-Chat are available, a request to use those chat modes with the contact can be sent using the corresponding green button (see the corresponding information below).

## • SMS text to a single user:

Everywhere you see a contact in estos ProCall you can send him a SMS text via the context menu or via the ActiveContacts. For this purpose the context menu offers all phone numbers which are to be found in the mobile phone number fields for the contact.

## Shat with a group

## Q AudioChat with a single user

Wherever in the estos ProCall a contact appears an AudioChat (if available) can be established with it using the context menu or using the ActiveContacts icons. If a **Chat window** is open (see above *Chat with single user*) an AudioChat can be established with the user by pressing the related green button. The AudioChat can be dropped anytime by pressing the red *hang-up* button. Further functions of the AudioChat dialog are explained at the chapter Audio/Video conversation window.

## VideoChat with a single user

Wherever in the estos ProCall a contact appears a VideoChat (if available) can be established with it using the context menu or using the ActiveContacts icons. If a **Chat Window** is open (see *Chat with Single User* above), VideoChat with that user can be requested by pressing the corresponding green button. As long as the other participant has not accepted the VideoChat request, the request can be terminated by clicking the red *Hang Up* button. Further information about the Audio- or Video-Chat features can be found in the Audio-/Video-Chat Window section.

## Share screen

If a **Chat window** is open your local screen can be shared with a remote contact by pressing the Share screen button. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator.

## Request Screen Sharing

Would you like to see another user's screen, in the **Chat window** you can also request to share the screen by clicking Request Screen Sharing. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator.

- To be able to send a SMS message to a user your user profile at the estos UCServer need the authorisation from the system administrator.
- The Audio/VideoChat feature is available only if it has been enabled, if Audio and Video devices are installed and if the system administrator granted the right to use it. How to change the Audio/Video functionality is described in chapter Presence at the bullet point Audio/Video devices. How to configure the Audio/Video devices for the usage with the Audio/VideoChat is described in chapter Audio/Video Wizard.

## 5.5.5.2 Moderators:

The initiator of a Chat is automatically the moderator. They have extended rights and can add and remove participants as well as appoint further moderators or remove moderator status.

## Add party

After clicking the button to add users the search dialog opens in which you can see all internal users. Select one or more users and confirm the dialog to add the participants.

Chat parties can be added per drag & drop to the Chat window (sending SMS messages for mobile contacts only, a estos UCServer Chat for internal users only).

The maximum number of participants is limited to 30.

## Remove participant

To remove a subscriber from the chat open the subscriber's context menu and select the relevant entry.

## Sample Appoint subscriber as moderator:

To appoint a subscriber as moderator, open the subscriber's context menu and select the relevant entry.

## Remove subscriber's moderator status:

To remove a subscriber's moderator status, open the subscriber's context menu and select the relevant entry.

## 5.5.5.3 Links:

estos ProCall supports the following links in the chat window:

#### Phone numbers:

Phone numbers are highlighted as such and can be selected by clicking them as long as they comply with the rules for the currently selected line's location. (phone:+4912345612, +49 123 456 - 12, 12 etc.)

#### F-mail links:

E-mails are recognised and the default mail program is started by clicking it. (mailto:info@info.de, info@info.de etc.)

#### Web links:

Recognises all Internet links such as. (http:, https:, www:, www2:, file:, ftp:, gopher:, ntp:, prospero:, telnet:, news:, wais:)

### • UNC paths:

Recognises UNC paths. (\\server\directory\file)



If links contain whitespaces estos ProCall cannot find the beginning and the end of the link itself. If you place these links between < and > brackets the link is correctly recognised. <a href="Link with space(s)"><u>Link with space(s)</u>></a>



To be able to chat with one participant, the Public authorization level must have been granted, at least. This authorization level may also be set administratively for internal users using global settings or group policies (see also Authorizations).

## 5.5.6 Audio/Video conversation window

The Audio-/Video conversation window is active while an Audio-/VideoChat conversation is present. Using the AudioChat mode no Video area is displayed thus the AudioChat window size is smaller than the VideoChat window size. But the usage for establishing Audio/VideoChats and the device handling is identical between Audio and VideoChat. The Audio/Video conversation window comprises of the contact area at the upper left corner and below a coloured keypad for Audio/VideoChat call control (e.g. accept calls, hang-up calls), a Text Chat area, below an area for Screen Sharing and a status line at the bottom. If Video is present the conversation window includes a video area at the right side including control buttons (overlays) becoming visible once the mouse moves over. The Chat area (text mode) at the left lower side can be used in any call state. If multiple video streams are shown (e.g. camera views and a shared screen) the major video picture can be changed by clicking on one of the minor video pictures. If the Audio-/Video conversation window is maximized the view changes to full screen mode. The full screen mode can be stopped by pressing the Escape key. The text based chat doesn't depend on any callstates and can be used any time.

## 5.5.6.1 Incoming Audio-/VideoChat

An incoming Audio-/VideoChat opens the AV conversation window. At the left upper corner the calling contact is displayed. A specific ringer sound plays at the speaker standard device to indicate the incoming Audio-/VideoChat to the user. While ringing an incoming VideoChat the local picture is shown at a large Video area at the right side of the window. The picture appears to be mirrored in order to allow users to check their appearance as using a real mirror:

# Accept an AudioChat

If the green button with the headset and text has been pressed for accepting calls, the call will be accepted. The status bar on the bottom left indicates the quality of the media connection.

## Accept VideoChat

If the green button with the triangle and text has been pressed for accepting calls, the call will be accepted. The status bar on the bottom left indicates the quality of the media connection. The local video image will be small and the remote participant's video image will appear large. The local Video area can be hidden by pressing a small triangle item at the lower right side of the large Video picture. The triangle item is a toggle button thus once pressed again the local video area appears back again.

# Reject an Audio/VideoChat

If the red button with the rectangle and text has been pressed for rejecting calls, the call will be rejected and the audio- or video-chat window will be closed.

## 5.5.6.2 Outgoing Audio-/VideoChat

With an outgoing Audio-/VideoChat the AV conversation window opens. At the left upper corner the called contact is shown. A specific ringback sound is played at the configured Audio device (e.g. headset) as soon as the remote device could be contacted and rings. If VideoChat is used the local picture is shown at the large right Video area. While running an outgoing VideoChat the local picture is shown at a large Video area at the right side of the window. The picture appears to be mirrored in order to allow users to check their apperance as using a real mirror. During the call establishment phase several operations are possible:

# Hang-up the Audio/VideoChat

If the red button with the rectangle item is pressed the outgoing Audio/VideoChat is disconnected and the Audio/Video conversation window is closed again. The called contact finds a small "bubble" message at the Windows® system tray in order to allow a comfortable call back per mouse click.

## 5.5.6.3 Connected Audio-/VideoChat

If the called contact accepted the Audio/VideoChat the parties can communicate with each other. Several options are possible:

# Hang-up the Audio/VideoChat

If the red button with the rectangle item is pressed the Audio-/VideoChat is disconnected and the Audio/Video conversation window is closed again. A specific disconnect sound is played to the Audio standard device indicating the closed call.

## • Quality and status line

During an Audio-/VideoChat the quality of the data stream is indicated by a small triangle bar item. The more black bars are shown the better is the data stream quality. Moving the mouse over the item additional information is presented to the user as tooltip text: overall quality (good/bad), transmit statistics ("TX" values), receive statistics ("RX" values), Codec used(e.g. "Opus" with Audio and "VP8" with Video), Video resolution (e.g. 640x480), consumed bandwidth in kilobit per second (kb/s), Jitter buffer in milliseconds (ms), Round-Trip-Time "RTT" in milliseconds (how long the signal takes forth and back) and the calculated available bandwidth for Audio- and Video signals (mostly not fully consumed). At the right side the connection status is shown (e.g. connected). Even more right the elapsed time for the Audio/VideoChat counts up.

## Mute button for Audio/Video devices

Near the red *Hang-up* button a small triangle button opens a menu for "muting" the microphone or the camera devices (if present).

## Microphone mute overlay button with VideoChat

In the small, local Video picture an overlay button to mute the microphone appears while moving over

with the mouse. While being muted the overlay button appears striked out. Pressing again the button turns back to normal.

## Camera mute overlay button with VideoChat

In the small, local Video picture an overlay button to mute the camera appears while moving over with the mouse. While being muted the overlay button appears striked out. Pressing again the button turns back to normal.



## Adapt Video picture size with VideoChat

In the main Video picture an overlay button to adapt the main Video size appears (to remove black stripes) while moving over with the mouse. Pressing the button again the Video size turns back to normal.

## • Control the remote Camera with VideoChat

If the remote camera supports remote control and if the remote user enabled the feature with the Audio/Video Wizard the local user can move the remote camera. The camera can be turned to the left (arrow key left), to the right (arrow key right), upwards (arrow key up) and downwards (arrow key down). Further it is possible to zoom-in (key "-") and to zoom-out (key "+"). The controlling user may also move the remote camera by using the mouse in the main Video picture with the related overlay buttons.

### Share screen

By pressing the Share screen button a local screen can be shared with a remote contact. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator.

## Request Screen Sharing

Would you like to see another user's screen, you can also request to share the screen by clicking Request Screen Sharing. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator.

In addition to the described methods how to accept and reject calls some USB devices offer the possibility to control the calls with device buttons (Human Interface Device "HID" buttons). This means that an Audio-/VideoChat can be accepted or dropped per device button. The microphone can be muted per device button. The supported devices and how to configure them can be found at the chapter Audio/Video Wizard.



The configuration of your Audio/Video devices to be used with Audio/VideoChat can be done with the Audio/Video Wizard.



The conversation window of a Audio-VideoChat includes also a Text Chat capability.

## 5.5.7 Screen Sharing

To enhance cooperation with estos ProCall you can share your screen with other ProCall users. So that the other user can see your screen content and control your mouse and keyboard once you have activated it.

Screen Sharing can be started from the context menue of an ActiveContact. The context menue is opened by a right-click on the ActiveContact. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator. Further the Screen Sharing can be added to an existing chat in the Chat window or while an Audio/VideoChat. More further a Screen Sharing session can be started from the Contact details.

If you are sharing your screen to another party, a small "Active Screen Sharing" status window appears. Clicking on the status window moves closed or minimized conversation windows back to the foreground.

## 5.5.7.1 Share a local screen with another user

If you have shared your screen with another user a conversation window is opened showing the connected user. At the beginning of a Screen Sharing session the remote control per mouse and keyboard is deactivated. The remote control per mouse and keyboard can be activated by clicking on the "Allow control" button. It can be disabled by clicking on the button toggled as "Disable control" button. If the conversation window is closed but a Screen Sharing session is still active a small "Active Screen Sharing" status window still remembers about its activity.

## 5.5.7.2 Request Screen Sharing

Would you like to see another user's screen, you can also request to share the screen. The other party must confirm or reject to share it. The remote control per mouse and keyboard can be enabled with the "Allow control" button and it can be disabled with the "Revoke control" button.

## 5.5.7.3 Select a screen for Screen Sharing

If multiple screens are available in a system for Screen Sharing, the "Share screen" button in the conversation window allows opening a small menue listing all screens available. The menue includes small preview pictures of each screen available. If no screen is selected or if only one screen is available the main screen is used. For privacy reasons remote users can't get preview pictures of your local system.

## 5.5.7.4 Using Audio-/VideoChat while running a Screen Sharing session

While a Screen Sharing session is already running an AudioChat can be added to the conversation. A camera video stream can be added to the AudioChat by opening the small menue near the "Hang up" button by selecting "Camera on". Also while an Audio/VideoChat is already running a Screen Sharing session can be added to the conversation. The upper big red "Hang up" button disconnects the entire session. The "Revoke Screen Sharing" button ends the Screen Sharing session only.

## 5.5.7.5 Full screen mode

If a user shared a screen with you the screen appears initially in a conversation window. If you maximize the conversation window you can see the session in full screen mode. If you move the mouse to the middle of the upper screen border a window bar appears including further control buttons e.g. to end the full screen mode. The full screen mode can also be terminated with the Escape key.

- To use the Screen Sharing, this feature must be available on the computers of both participants.
- Screen Sharing is also possible for SIP federated ProCall users across network borders. The feature is available only if the related rights are granted by the administrator and if it is supported by the product versions on both sides. Requesting Screen Sharing between federated users is not supported for security reasons.
- An administrator UAC (User Account Control) prompt per Screen Sharing is not supported.

  Applications started with UAC as administrator can't be used within a Screen Sharing session.

## 6 Customise estos ProCall

estos ProCall functions can be customised to your needs in many places. The first is the **settings** dialog, which you can acces via the main menu.

The dialog is divided into the following catagories:

- Appearance and behavior
- Telephony
- Search
- Integration
- Collaboration

## 6.1 Appearance and behavior

In this category you can customize the view of the client, control the behavior in certain events, assign hotkeys and shortcuts, add locations and use advanced service functions.

- View
- Characteristics
- Actions
- Action filter
- Action fields
- User-defined actions
- Hotkeys
- Shortcuts
- Location
- Advanced
- Customize dialogs with templates
- Control functions via Windows® Registry

### 6.1.1 View

## 6.1.1.1 Presence icons

The Presence icons in the client represent the status of the estos ProCall user.



Normally you always use the default symbol set. However, your administrator can provide own symbol sets to you.

#### 6.1.1.2 Element width

The contacts and function buttons in the monitor and in the Favorites tab are displayed in columns if the window width permits. With the "Element width" option you can influence as from which width a further column or a column less is displayed. Please note that the entire available window width is always used.

## 6.1.1.3 Level of detail

The level of detail can be selected separately for the main window (Favorites, talk and chat windows, etc.) and the monitor. There are 3 levels available:

Low	This is the most compact setting, displays just the color of the presence and the name of the contact in one line.
Medium	At this stage, the corresponding contact picture (if available) for each contact and CTI information is displayed (phone lines, Calls, diversions).
High	Compared to the "Medium" level, just with larger Contact imagse and additionally the position in the company.

## 6.1.1.4 Deposited contact with presence color

If this option is activated, every registered contact is stored in the monitor and in Favorites with his current presence color. The background of unregistered contacts remains unchanged.

## 6.1.1.5 Additional lines

The additional lines will be configured by the administrator on the estos UCServer. Normally these lines do not have an explicit owner but should be monitored and controlled by estos ProCall users, like a phone line in the warehouse of the company. You can still decide for yourself whether you wish to display these lines or not. If you activate this option, the additional lines are displayed in a separate sub-group on the Favourites tab. Please note that this sub-group is fixed and canot be edited.

The line group is automatically updated if the administrator configures it accordingly.
 To edit the line group, a new sub-group must be created and all elements of the line group copied there. Afterwards, the option Additional lines can be deactivated. Please note that the line group is no longer automatically updated if the administrator adds or removes lines.
 Changes to the settings on this page have an immediate effect on estos ProCall (preview). These settings are, however, only stored when confirmed with OK.

## 6.1.2 Characteristics

### 6.1.2.1 General

## Display estos ProCall with Windows® log-on

Use this option if estos ProCall is to be started automatically when the system re-boots. The client is always started minimised in this case.

### Show start process

Check this checkbox if you want more detailed information to be shown on the screen when estos ProCall starts.

## 6.1.2.2 Monitor

### • Show at program start

Automatically re-opens the monitoring program, when ProCall is re-started. This setting is useful when you want to temporarily close the monitor window during your session, however it should be re-started when ProCall is also re-started.

### • At program startup as last

In this mode, the monitoring program will only be displayed when it starts, if it had been open when the last ProCall session ended.

## 6.1.2.3 Show speech bubble for

If at least one of this settings are active a speech bubble will show you the according information near the windows taskbar.

#### Missed calls

Display of all unanswered calls

#### Unread E-Mails

Display of new e-mails in the in-box

#### Chats

Display of unanswered chats

#### Planned calls

Display of planned calls due

### • Challenge-Response

Display of open Challenge-Responses

## • Unread Fax-Messages

Display of new Fax messages in the Inbox

### 6.1.2.4 Advanced

## • Open Contacts by default for editing

Contacts are normally opened for display in estos ProCall. Alternatively, you can set-up the contacts to be always open for editing. By keeping the CONTROL key pressed down, you can switch to the operation not selected by default when clicking on a contact.

## Commit contact detail tabs last selected to memory

With this function, you will open the contact detail window always with in the same tab. If you close the contact detail window in the tab "Unprocessed", the page "Unprocessed" will automatically appear when you next open a contact.

### • Register as standard-telephony application

Here you can control whether estos ProCall should automatically register itself automatically at start as a standard-telephony application. The standard-telephony application takes on telephone dialing requests on the TAPI level and diverts this to the telephone or telephone system.

#### Play notification sounds

Notification sounds of estos ProCall will be configured through the audio scheme of Microsoft® Windows®. You can switch off notification sounds altogether here and open the relevant Windows® settings page.

## 6.1.3 Actions

## Automate estos ProCall:

estos ProCall enables you to execute numerous of actions if defined events occur (ringing phone for example). The following tabel givs you a brief overview:

Event	Description
In case of an incoming call	Occurs when your phone rings.
In case of an outgoing	Occurs, when you have established a call and the phone rings with your

call	respondent.
At the end of a call	Occurs when the call (not connected) or the conversation (connected) was ended.
When call is answered	Occurs when you accept an incoming call or your dialog partner accepts an your call.
When the remote call party changes	Occurs when the dialog partner changes during the call.
After logging on to the server	Occurs when the user could log on estos UCServer successful.
After logging off from the server	Occurs when estos ProCall properly log off from the server. This is particularly the case when estos ProCall shuts down, but not when the compound is separated from the estos UCServer.
In case of an appointment (busy)	Occurs when an appointment in Outlook® which is marked with the "busy" attribute becomes due.
In case of appointment (out of office)	Occurs when an appointment in Outlook® which is marked with the "absent" attribute becomes due.
Automatically opened contact detail window	Occurs when a contact details window open by estos ProCall automatically.
After xx minutes idling	Occurs, when you have pressed no key or moved your mouse in xx minutes.

## 6.1.3.1 Create new action:

- 1. Click **Add new action** and select the event when the action is to be executed in future.
- 2. Click **Choose action** and select the action which is to be executed by the selected event.
- 3. Make sure that the checkbox to the left of the selected event is active (checked). The action will only then be executed. You can also uncheck the checkbox if the action should not to be performed at present but will be needed later.

## 6.1.3.2 Activate/deactivate action

You can create an action for later use or temporarily deactivate an already created action if you deselect the hook on the left, beside the event field. As soon as the hook is input again, the event happens.

## 6.1.3.3 Remove actions

Actions which are no longer required can be removed with the "Delete" button at any time. The action to be removed must first be marked. Alternatively you can select the **Remove action** entry in the event field.

## 6.1.3.4 Use Actions filter


estos ProCall allows you to limit certain events by the aid of action filters, or to describe something more specifically. To put in an Action filter or to change, click on the filter button in the suitable row.

- Up until now no Action filter was defined or the Action filters were deactivated. Click on this button to apply an Action filter or to activate the Action filter.
- An action filter was defined and activated. Click on this button to change the Action filter or to deactivate the Action filter.

You can find further information in the section Action filter.

## 6.1.3.5 User-defined actions

estos ProCall gives you the option to create actions by yourself. These can be additionally selected when an event in the action list occurs. To create a new action, click the "Actions" button. More information about this is available in the section user defined actions.



## 6.1.4 Action filter

Action filters are rules which describe events more exactly and which allow you to therefore explain actions only in certain cases. The action is executed only if *all* given rules apply.

Set the check mark to **use filter** in order to create a filter. Remove the check if you want to disable an already defined filter, however it is not deleted immediately.

Click on the button **Add...** and choose the field name whose field value should fulfil a condition. Here you are offered every action fields.

After you have chosen the field name, enter the rule in the column **Regular expression** which the field value must fulfil.

## 6.1.4.1 Regular expressions

A brief overview of the permitted expressions:

Character	Description

۸	The beginning of the string. With the Caret at the beginning of the regular expression, it is determined that the field value must agree from the outset. The expression "^o " means that the field value must begin with "o ".
٨	The caret (^) directly after the left bracket ([) has another meaning. It is used to exclude the other signs within the bracket. The expression "[^o-4] " permits only figures except o to 4.
\$	The dollar character (\$) calls the end of the string. The expression "152\$" is valid only for strings which end with "152".
I	The sign ( ) permits both characters between it. The expression "8 9" permits "8" or "9".
	The point (.) permits every character (or every figure).
*	The Star (*) indicates, that the character to the left must exist O times or more.
+	The Plus (*) is similar to the Star, only that the character to the left must exist at least 1 time.
?	The question mark (?) indicates, that the character to the left must exist O or 1 time.
[]	The corner brackets ([ and ]) indicate the amount of characters that are permitted at this point.
1	The Backslash is used as an Escape sequence. If you want to search for "+", you must write "\+".
•	Tip: The Caret sign (^) can be found on the top left of a German keyboard.

# 6.1.4.2 Check filter

You can check your input immediately here. Enter a value as an example in the field of the same name. The example value is applied to all regular expressions. The symbols beside the field name indicate whether the example value on the regular expression fits.

- The blue symbol indicates that either no example value was entered, or that the entered example value does not fit on the regular expression.
- The green symbol indicates that the entered example value on the regular expression fits.
- The red symbol indicates that the regular expression is not valid. In this case correct the regular expression.

Please note that in certain events not all fields can be used. Thus no appointment fields are available, e.g. for telephony events. An entire overview of all fields, as well as which fields are available with which events, can be found in the section action fields.



Action fields that represent a timestamp, such as <Appointment.StartTime> use the date format configured for the local computer. This corresponds to the display of dates, as estos ProCall displays them in the log view in the Date column. For example, "Mo 02.07.2012 15:10:25" (Germany) or "Mon 7/2/2012 3:10:25 PM" (USA). The Date column can be added to the column headers on the **Journal** tab page by right-clicking the column header with the mouse.

# 6.1.5 Action fields

While editing User-defined actions in estos ProCall you can use placeholders which were replaced when the action is executed with actual data (e.g. the phone number of the participant in the discussion will be filled in). These placeholders can also be used for action filters.

The Action fields can be divided into three different groups:

- Telephony-Action fields
- Contact-Action fields
- Appointment-Action fields

### 6.1.5.1 Telephony-Action fields

<call.msnsc></call.msnsc>	Own extension number in canonical format.
<call.msnname></call.msnname>	Name found for the own extension number.
<call.redirectingsc></call.redirectingsc>	The forwarding phone number in canonical format.
<call.redirectingname></call.redirectingname>	The name of the contact who forwarded the call.
<call.holdnumbersc></call.holdnumbersc>	The number of the contact that is being on hold.
<call.createdtime></call.createdtime>	The time at which the call has been created on the server.
<call.connectedtime></call.connectedtime>	The time at which the call was accepted.
<call.disconnectedtime></call.disconnectedtime>	The time at which the call has been terminated.

# 6.1.6 User-defined actions

User-defined actions serve to implement programmes with certain phone call actions. Some information can be transferred at the start of the programme as a command line. In most cases it will concern applications developed yourself which carry out additional functions, e.g. when a phone call is signalled.

All configured actions are displayed in the list. You can add new actions and edit or delete existing ones.

#### Action name

Allocate a name here, which is indicated. This name is for your information only and is recorded on the list of available actions on the settings page Behavior.

#### **Application**

Give the path for the application which you want to complete here. You can also specify the document to be opened. In addition, specific field names which are replaced at Program start with the corresponding values of the phone call, contact or appointment, can be entered here. You can find an overview in the section action fields.

#### **Command line**

Give here which command line of the program should be transferred. As with the application line, the given

fields which are replaced by Program start with the corresponding values of the phone call, contact or appointment, can be used here. You can find an overview in the section action fields.

### Directory

The list in use should be begun.

#### Mode

Here you can state how the program should start (maximised, minimised, normal or hidden). Not every program evaluates this parameter!

#### Example:

It should be a user-defined action which opens the homepage of the caller automatically.

- 1. Give the action a descriptive name, e.g. "web page open".
- 2. Enter in the application line, the entire path to your Internet browser, e.g. "C:\programFiles (x86)\Mozilla Firefox\firefox.exe".
- 3. As a parameter, the browser expects the URL of the Internet site to be opened. The URL is restored by estos ProCall in the contact-action field "WebPageURL". Enter in the command line of the field names "< Contact. WebPageURL>" or click on "field add" and select the entry of the same name from the list.
- 4. You do not have to state the compete list. Simply leave the line "list" free.
- 5. Because the browser with the homepage should be indicated, set the mode to "Normal start".

### 6.1.7 Hotkeys

The term hotkey describes the option of defining system-wide key combinations which permit phone numbers to be dialed or calls to be ended (hang up) out of almost all programs. You define the key combination in this settings dialog.

#### Dial selected phone number, otherwise start Contact Search.

To dial a number with the shortcut key, the number has to be selected with mouse in the according window, then press the shortcut key. If there is no phone number selected, estos ProCall tries to search for a contact instead.



You can use the hotkey in Outlook® itself. You can thus dial any phone number in a contact by marking the phone number. Use the hotkey also to transfer a contact to the phone status window. You can also start callback from the journal with the hotkey.



Dialing from a console application (DOS window):

If the phone number cannot be selected directly by the mouse, then first activate the DOS Console's Editing Mode using [ALT]+[Spacebar].

### Use this hotkey also for accepting a call

If this option is selected, incoming calls can be answered with the same hotkey as is used for dialing (if your phone supports this feature).

#### Shortcut key for hanging up

Here you can define the hotkey for ending the active connection. Type in the key combination (special keys such as Alt, CTRL and Shift are also possible). You delete the hotkey with the Del key.

### Display main window

This Hotkey brings the main window of estos ProCall on screen and you can immediatly start searching contacts.

These hotkeys are configured system wide, so no other application can use the same key combinations for other actions.

Dialing with the hotkey uses the Windows® clipboard and the keyboard shortcut [CTRL+C]. The contents of the clipboard can be changed at the same time and the shortcut [CTRL+C] not used as a hotkey. Consider these restrictions with the use of this function.

Phone numbers or contacts cannot be dialed (or searched) from applications that have been started with higher administration rights than estos ProCall.

If the hotkey has been pressed in such an application, an information dialog will provide a reminder. estos ProCall can only display this reminder if the hotkey is used in combination with or (a Windows® restriction).

If phone numbers cannot be dialed, advanced users can attempt to give the other applications more time so that this data can be provided. See Function control via Windows® Registry for more information.

#### 6.1.8 Shortcuts

To increase productivity, certain application features can be assigned to key shortcuts. Thereby, certain tasks and features can be started, opened or executed using a simple shortcut.

The list contains all available features, sorted by units, that can be assigned to shortcuts.

## Assign a shortcut to a feature:

Click on the second column so that a text entry cursor will appear. Then simply press the desired key combination.

#### Delete a shortcut:

The Delete button can be used for this purpose. If you are currently in the process of assigning a new key, simply press [Del].

#### Reset all shortcuts to their default values:

The two buttons "Reset" and "Reset All" are available for this purpose.

- The shortcuts for features that have been grayed out cannot be modified. This can be because of the following reasons:
  - 1. The shortcuts may have been assigned by the manufacturer.
  - 2. The shortcut has been assigned by the System Administrator using group policies.

If a conflict is discovered between the choosen hotkey and a hotkey from another application, an alternative hotkey should be choosen, or remove the other hotkey from the other application first.

### 6.1.9 Location

The location settings contain all the necessary information to permit correct dialing and correct display of phone numbers. These settings are especially important if you are using a phone system or if your phone is

attached to a phone system, otherwise external numbers could not be dialed and the dispalying a phone number would not function correctly.

The country, dialing code and phone or phone system settings are configured exclusively in estos UCServer and cannot therefore be changed in the client. If you have assigned several lines, the location settings always refer to the selected default line.


You can configure in which format the phone numbers should be shown in estos ProCall. Internal phone numbers will always be shown in short notation.

#### Address

You should enter your location's address here. This information is necessary and is used exclusively for the map function and route planning.

#### Map/route planning

Select a service from the list which you wish to use for the map function and route planning. You can choose the language in which the route information is displayed.



#### 6.1.10 Advanced

### Display all messages

estos ProCall often uses message windows which you can automatically suppress for future similar cases with the "Do not show again" option. Use this function to re-display all message windows which would otherwise not be opened again.

### Reset layout

Click here to reset the current layout of the client to default. This implies restoring the default column widths in the tabs (e.g. journal, planned calls etc.) and a reordering of all tabs in the main window. Contacts saved are still remain.

### 6.1.11 Dialog adaptation with Templates

estos ProCall uses XSLT templates to display XML data as HTML pages. The XSLT templates are in the *Templates or Templates/default* folder.

Directory	Deployment
templates	You should save files you have changed in this directory if you wish to change one of the files supplied in templates/default.
templates/default	Configuration files which were installed with the product. These are overwritten if the

product is updated.

### XSLT processor

estos ProCall provides the files in XML format. These XML files are processed into an HTML page with the help of an XSLT template and an XSLT processor. Sablotron or Microsoft® XML Parser are used as XSLT processors.

### Development of own templates

You can develop and use your own templates. You should familiarise yourself with XSLT syntax for this. You can find help on the subject athttp://www.w3schools.com/xsl/ or the Microsoft® MSDN pages.

If you wish to use templates you have developed by yourself these should be stored in the *template* directory. Your changes will then not be lost if an product update is installed.

common.xslt	Provides different template functions for e-mail and web links and for transcoding sets of characters
unanswered.xslt	E-mail messages regarding unanswered calls. More precise details can be found in the estos UCServer help file.
contact.xslt	Overview page in the Contact details window.

LocalContact.xslt	Is used in the Call window to prepare the details for a called contact. The called contact is displayed if a contact for an incoming call to the phone number is found. You must activate the hotline service in the settings for Incoming calls for this. The template defines which contact details are displayed.
RedirectedContact.xslt	Is used in the Call window to prepare the contact details for a redirected call. You are shown the contact for whom the call was last signalled. The template defines which contact details are displayed.

When changing the templates, please keep in mind that the *common.xslt* must always be in the same directory as the template using the *common.xslt*.

# 6.1.12 Function control via Windows® Registry

All necessary settings which are saved in the Windows® registry can be changed in the estos ProCall user interface. You can, nevertheless, also activate or deactivate special functions in estos ProCall by means of certain keys.



Please note that the functions mentioned here only make sense in exceptional cases and their use is not generally recommended.

All the following listed registry values are expected in the

**HKEY\_CURRENT\_USER\Software\estos\UCServer4\CtiMain** key. The registry value must be created below this key to enable the relevant function in estos ProCall.

# 6.2 Telephony

In **Telephony** you can customize the call window to your needs, choose settings for incoming, outgoing, unprocessed and planned calls and also define projects. Additionally you can configure your Bluetooth connection here.

- Conversation window
- Incoming calls
- Outgoing calls
- Planned calls
- Projects
- Bluetooth Cell Phones

# 6.2.1 Conversation window

# Display automatically for incoming calls Display automaticaly for outgoing calls

You can define whether you wish the call window to be displayed for incoming or outgoing calls. If the window is not displayed automatically you can display it at any time during the call via the estos ProCall task bar.

### Always display active calls as the topmost window

You should activate this option if you wish to always display active calls as the topmost window. If the window is automatically displayed, it is normally displayed as the topmost window for an incoming or outgoing call but can then subsequently be covered by other windows. You can bring all curent calls into the foreground via the tray icon at any time.

### Duration of displaying the conversation window after the call ends

After ending the telephone call the call window remains open for a certain amount of time. During this time it's possible to allocate this call, for example to a certain Project or to enter a short note. Here you can specify how long the window should remain open.

### Transparency, support display and fading out

The call window supports transparency and is normally faded in and out. If you do not wish to use this function you should deactivate the transparency.

#### Window position

You can define the position as to where the call window opened by estos ProCall. Call windows for prepared calls are excluded. These windows are always opened at the current position of the mouse.

#### Default position (task bar icon)

ProCall opens the conversation window at an appropriate location on the screen. Other, already open windows of ProCall are not overlaid.

#### Remember last position

The conversation window appears again at the same position where you have closed it the last time or where it was automatically hidden.

### • Define position using preview

Open a call window with the preview button and place it where windows should open it in future. Moving the conversation window during a call has no effect on the display position.

### 6.2.2 Incoming calls

### Support for Hotline-Services (client function)

The hotline service analyses the number called for incoming calls (multi-entity capability). Analysis of the number called can be used to differentiate between various companies if you have to announce yourself differently depending on the number called (e.g. for a secretarial service).

Activate the option **Display called contact**, so that the contact information is displayed in the Call window of an incoming phone call. What information should be displayed can be defined via a template.

#### **Unanswered calls**

The estos UCServer recognizes missed phone calls and checks whether the phone call was answered from a call group or call diversion. Notifications can be sent as an e-mail for these missed calls. With these settings it can be defined to which e-mail addresses unanswered phone calls are sent and whether these notifications should be also sent if the user is logged on to the server. Moreover, unanswered calls can be automatically marked as processed when a telephone call was made to the same contact at a later date.



In addition to the server-side search for client contacts, local client folders can be specified in the settings of the Data sources.



If the matching client contact should be opened automatically during the phone call, then it can be specified in the settings Actions.

### 6.2.3 Outgoing calls

#### Call preparation

The option **Always prepare phone calls** enables you to set projects projects or set the private marker on the calls. This setting is not needed if projects or the marking of private calls are not used.

### **Automatic redialing**

If an outgoing call does not go through because the line is busy, you can start automatic redialing in the call window. You can define how often the system will try to connect the call and at which intervals. Automatic redialing is terminated as soon as the line is no longer busy or the set number of attempted calls has been reached.

#### Suppression of caller ID

You can activate the suppression of caller ID for outgoing calls if this is supported by your telephone system. You may activate caller ID suppression for all outgoing calls or choose case by case whether you wish to suppress caller ID. If you wish to suppress caller ID in individual cases only, an additional button for activating or deactivating this option appears in the call window. Please keep in mind that this option must be activated before you start the call so that the caller ID can be suppressed.

#### 6.2.4 Planned calls

With planned calls, you can have yourself reminded at a specified time of calls to be made or plan upcoming calls in advance. Planned calls appear in the main window on the tab of the same name.

estos ProCall offers you two options for managing planned calls:

estos ProCall

#### • Administration with estos UCServer (recommended):

Planned calls are only saved in estos UCServer and can be added and changed in the estos UCServer editor.

### Management with Outlook®

Planned calls are saved exclusively in Outlook® and can only be saved with the Outlook® editor. Please note that the possibilities for subsequent alterations to the phone number and the linked contact are limited as only Outlook® contacts can be subsequently linked.

# 6.2.5 Projects

estos ProCall helps the user assign calls to previously defined projects. This feature is also available from the Journal as well as the telephone system itself. The project identifier should be selected from the server through the system as would be appropriate for the project settings. Making private calls through so-called calling card providers is the exception to this. If a call is marked as private, the call through the telephone system can be configured using the identifying numbers.

If the Mark private calls option is activated a call can be marked, for example, as private in the call window.

To prevent others seeing private numbers or callers they can be marked as private. Any call information is not visible to others in the journal.

Prerequisite: estos UCServer is set to not save phone numbers. See also Telephone Journal in the estos UCServer help file.



If private conversations are not allowed in the company, having the administrator deactivate this option in estos UCServer or in the group policies is reasonable.

#### Use projects and code numbers


In estos ProCall, projects are predominantly configured for the journal. In addition, specifics PINs and calling card providers can be defined for private conversations. If the project has been defined as a private call then the PIN will be used for the call and it will not logged in the journal.

The following rules apply:

0-9 * #	Digits which are dialed normally
С	Here you wait for the remote station to accept the call.
e <b>,</b> E	Place-holder for entering a PIN. With E, the number of digits for entry is not important. With e, the number of digits is defined by the number of letters (eee for three digits).

р, Р	Dialing pause: 'p' for 0.5 seconds, 'P' for 1 second.
N	Space for the number to be chosen. If the space is not set, the number is automatically transferred to the end.
J	Defines, if available, that the user login and pin number entered by the user is noted in the journal.
X	If available, the phone number should be dialed with an external prefix. If 'X' is absent the phone number is dialed in national format (03012345678).

In the user interface configured projects are visualised centrally and locally with differently coloured Icons:



### 6.2.6 Bluetooth

# **Support for Bluetooth Cell Phones**

Cell phones can be connected with the PC using Bluetooth. This connection will make controlling and monitoring of the telephone possible. The telephone must support the Bluetooth handsfree profile. This is also be used with a speaker phone in the car.

All cell phones that have been connected with the PC can be automatically used. Alternatively, only those telephones that are desired for use can be selected from the list of connected devices.

# Connect New Devices with the PC (Bluetooth pairing)

The cell phone must be connected with the PC (Bluetooth pairing) in order to be able to use it.

#### Phonebook

The Phonebook of the mobilephone/cellphone can be optionally integrated.

#### Offline journal

If the Bluetooth connection will be interrupted and available at a later moment, all calls will be synchronized. Please note that such calls have no duration at the journal.

### 6.3 Search

In **Search** you can control the search behavior of estos ProCall, in particular by selecting which data sources and search-parameters should be used in the detail search.

- Data sources
- Search parameter
- Search result

#### 6.3.1 Data sources

The data source settings contain the list of all contact data sources which are to be used when searching for contact definition. estos ProCall automatically inserts the data sources for estos ProCall users, the lines, the estos ProCall favorites and the estos MetaDirectory centrally configured in estos UCServer. Also data sources which are administratively defaulted by group guidelines are automatically entered.

Using the data source estos ProCall favorites you can search all contacts in your favorites and thus find quickly.

In addition, your personal inbox is imported from Outlook® when estos ProCall is started if you have Outlook® installed on your computer and have not specified any other folders. The IBM Notes® default address book is configured in the same way.

### 6.3.1.1 General settings

The search behavior can be set for each data source in the list. The general settings can be changed directly in the overview list or by clicking the **Edit** button on the **General** tab.

# Use in search filter "All"

If this option is selected for a data source the data source is searched if the "All" filter is selected in the search field.

### • Search on incoming call

For every call, estos ProCall automatically searches data sources for the phone number in order to find the call partner. You can define here which data sources are to be used for this. It is recommended that especially slow data sources are not searched when contact search.

#### • Use if tenant function

In addition to the phone number search to find out the call participant, ProCall can also search a contact, the client, for the phone number on your own telephone. This function is useful, e.g. for hotline services, and you should only activate it if the data source contains client contacts and you want to show the client contact, e.g., in the call window. Please note that the tenant function can not be used for the data source "estos ProCall user" as well as for phonebook data sources.

### Treat as unpersonalized data source

As well as your personal contact data sources you can also use estos ProCall with unpersonalized data

sources (mainly phone books). However, the search of phone books only makes sense if there is no contact in your personal contact data sources which corresponds to the search criteria. Activate this setting if the data source should only be searched when no contact is found in the personal data sources already searched. Phone book data sources are a typical application case.

### 6.3.1.2 Data source search sequence:

estos ProCall permits you to define the order in which the data sources are searched. The topmost data source in the list is always processed first. Click the **Move up** button to move the selected data source up one place. Similarly, use the **Move down** button to move the selected data source one place lower down in the list. Please note that all data sources with the **Treat as phone book** option are always searched at the end and therefore must always be at the bottom of the list.

### 6.3.1.3 Adding data sources

New data sources can be linked at any time in estos ProCall. For this, click the **Add** button and select the data source option.

### Wording Wording Wording Outlook®

Click here to add an Outlook® mailbox or a specific Outlook® contact folder to the search list. Please note that you can only select mailboxes or contact folders in the selection dialog. If you add a mailbox this is automatically configured so that all subordinate contact folders are also used in the search. Subordinate folders are not, however, included for added contact folders. This behavior can be altered at any time with **Edit**.

# Exchange Web Services

The Contacts folder can be added using Exchange Web Services from here. As with Outlook®, all subfolders for mailboxes will be used automatically, but not with normal folders.

#### IBM Notes®

Click here to add a IBM Notes® address book to the search list. The configuration dialog assists you with integration and offers default settings. You can change the configuration at any time with "Edit".

# Billion

Click here to add an ODBC data source to the search list. You can thus use contact data which you have stored, for example in a Microsoft® Excel file or a Microsoft Access® database, directly in estos ProCall.

The configuration dialog supports you with connection and specifies default values. You can modify the configuration at any time with **Edit**.

Please note that for this function the appropriate ODBC driver must be present on your system. The use of a estos MetaDirectory is recommended to integrate larger data stocks for performance reasons.

## III Add phone book

estos ProCall offers you the option of adding phone books installed locally on your computer. Although estos ProCall automatically recognises locally installed phone books it may be necessary to specify the installation manually. With installation of the "Das Telefonbuch Deutschland" or "Herold" please manually configure the installation path of the product, with the installation of "TwixTel" the path must be always given to the data CD.

Please note that for the integration of the "Herold" phone books the licence key for the phone book DVD network application (or phone book CD intranet application) is required, in addition to a licence name API and API-Key. The error message "The programmer licence key is not valid" points to the fact that either no API-Key was entered, or the given API-Key does not fit to the API Key-licence name nor to the licence key of the phone book application. The Herold API licence name and API Key can also be rolled out administratively, while this is entered on the Registry value "HeroldAPILicenseName" and "HeroldAPIKey" (cf. control function via Windows® Registry).

You can also integrate phone books into estos ProCall which are not installed locally but centrally. For this, you must configure the phone book in the estos MetaDirectory and connect the estos MetaDirectory as a phone book.

# II Add MetaDirectory or LDAP data source

You can integrate both a estos MetaDirectory and normal LDAP data sources into estos ProCall with the help of the database wizard. Field allocation is automatic in the case of estos MetaDirectory.

### Material

Click here to add the DATEV SDD database to the search list.

### 6.3.1.4 Editing data sources

Specific data source properties can be viewed or modified via the **Edit**button. Alternatively you can double-click a data source list entry.

# \* Adjust favorite data source

In the event that a company name has not been explicitly provided by the federation participant, check the **Fill empty company names from the presence domain entries for federation contacts** checkbox, to find Federation contacts based on company name when searching Favorites. When checked, the presence domain will be interpreted as the company name for federation contacts.

#### Edit Outlook® folders

Select the **Include all sub-folders when searching** option on the **Advanced** tab if all subordinate contact folders should be searched in addition to the folder itself.

On the **Name search** tab you can specify a list of fields which should be additionally included in name searches in Outlook® folders. The Last name, First name and Company fields are already searched by default. Please note that the name search fields apply globally for all Outlook® folders.

#### Example:

Click < Add field here > and select the Item. Department entry from the list. The subsequent name search will then find all Outlook® contacts which match the search criterion in the Department field.

# Kervices

The settings available are the same as those for Outlook® folders.

# Edit IBM Notes® folders

The tab **Advanced** displays the most important details of the selected IBM Notes® Directory. Select the button **Configure** in order to change the parameters.

### • Edit ODBC connection

The tab **Advanced** displays the most important details of the selected ODBC connection. Select the button **Configure** in order to change the parameters.

### Edit phone book

Here you can query the installation path and the current status and, if necessary, information about the connected phone book. Please note that the installation path can only be changed if you remove and re-attach the current phone book.

# Edit MetaDirectoryor LDAP data source

On the **Advanced** tab, information can be retrieved about the selected data source or configuration of the data source. The database wizard assists with this. Please note that a centrally configured estos MetaDirectory can only be changed in estos UCServer and not in estos ProCall.

#### Edit DATEV SDD data source

Check **Use Comments from Communication Details as the Contact Person's Name** so that contacts maintained in the Comments entry in DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro can also be found.

Please note that with data sources that are administratively defaulted by group guidelines, the configuration cannot be edited by the User.

### 6.3.1.5 Deleting data sources

Click the **Delete** button to remove a data source. Please note that some data sources cannot be removed. These include the estos ProCall users, estos UCServer's lines, the estos ProCall favorites and the estos MetaDirectory centrally configured on estos UCServer. Also data sources cannot be deleted which are administratively defaulted by group guidelines.

If a data source could not be integrated this is indicated by an exclamation mark in the data source icon. An error description is displayed in the tooltip if you place a mouse pointer over the data source icon.
 Local mail boxes from Outlook® or IBM Notes® are added autimatically at the start of estos ProCall if no data sources were configured for Outlook® or IBM Notes®.
 If at Start, estos ProCall recognises a phone book that until now is not configured, this is included in the data source list automatically.
 ⚠ "Das Telefonbuch Deutschland" or "Herold" must be installed on your computer with the phone book data bank. To copy the phone book database (without installation) is not sufficient.
 ⚠ DATEV integration automatically gives priority to contacts from DATEV databases for the resolution of phone numbers after initial installation. This setting can be changed by the user in the database

#### 6.3.2 Search parameter

settings.

On the settings page "Search parameters" you can define the fields which estos ProCall uses in the detail search. There you can define their order and other options for the detailed search.

The following search parameters are preset in estos ProCall:

- Last name
- First name
- Company
- Customer ID
- Department
- Postcode/City
- Street
- Phone number
- Presence-/e-mail address

#### Customize the search parameter sequence

Use the "Up" or "Down" buttons to shift the search-parameter either upwards or downwards in the list. The search-parameter order in the list determines their position in the detail search.

### Activate or deactivate search parameter

The search parameters can be activated and deactivated. Only enabled search parameters are used in the detailed search. Checkmark the box on the list to activate the search parameter. Delete the checkmark on the list entry not to use the search parameter in the detailed search.

#### User-defined search parameter

User-defined search parameters can also be laid out in estos ProCall beside the given search parameters. These allow the user to consider other contact fields not normally displayed in the detail search.

### Configure user-defined search parameter

Click on **Add** to create a new user-defined search parameter. Click on **Edit...** to change the selected user-defined search parameter.

- 1. Allocate a name to the user-defined search-parameter. This name is used in the list of all search-parameters and in the tool tip for the detail search.
- 2. Select the corresponding contact fields which should be considered in this search-parameter. A user-defined search-parameter can also search several contact fields at the same time. In this case the contact is found when the search word matches the content of only one contact field.

# Example:

A user-defined search-parameter should be added in order to find a contact by its SIP-Address in the detail search.

- Enter SIPAddress in the name field.
- 2. Tick the box before the field name to select the "SIPAddress" in the contact field list.
- 3. Confirm your entry with **OK**.



With the command **delete** every user-defined search-parameter can be deleted again. Please note that only user-defined search-parameters can be edited or deleted.

### 6.3.3 Search result

Here the search result can be adapted and defined for the user. With this the order of the contact fields to be displayed can be set as well as their appearance and click actions.

#### Available contact fields

In the list of the available contact fields the corresponding tick-box next to a contact field can be activated if this contact field should always be shown in the search results. With the buttons **Up**or**Down** you are able to change the order of the contact fields in the search results.

### **Customize Layout settings**

On the **layout** tab the general appearance of the selected contact field can be adapted.

Layout Option	Description
Display in compact view	Indicates whether the contact field is also displayed in the compact view. If the box is not ticked, the contact field is only shown in the detail view.
Display field names	Specifies if the field name should be displayed next to the account of the contact field.
Insert paragraph before field	Allows a better overview with the help of paragraphs to group and structure contact fields.
Display in bold type	With this option the contact field is displayed in bold type and is thereby

emphasised.


#### tab Customize field


Here you can further customize the appearance of the contact field selected from the contact field list. The setting possibilities vary, depending on the selected contact field.


### Specify contact field actions

On the **Actions** tab, actions which are executed by clicking on the contact field can be changed. All contact functions of the contact menu are available here as well as all User-defined actions.

In addition, up to three different actions can be put on one contact field, either by using no key, holding down the CTRL key or holding down the Shift and CTRL key together, while clicking on the corresponding contact field in the search result list.







# 6.4 Integration

Calendar and journal connections are controlled in Integration.

- Calendar
- Journal
- DATEV

# 6.4.1 Calendar

Appointment dates are transferred from the client to estos UCServer in order to permit estos ProCall to display them and pass them on. They are stored temporarily, consulted for creating your own presence and displayed to other users who have the appropriate user rights.

Appointment details can presently be read either from the Outlook® or from the IBM Notes® diary. In Windows® 10 you can also use the included calendar app.

If you use multiple Systems, you can select the system you use as the data source.

A user has the option of limiting the amount of appointment data which is made available to the system. The following options can be selected:

#### None

No data is transferred to the server. This data is then not displayed to other users and the information is not included when determing your own presence status.

#### Public appointments only (default setting)

Only appointments which are marked as public are transferred to the server. They are then available for other users and for determining your presence.

#### Private and public appointments

All appointment information is transferred to the server and is available to other users and can be used to determine your presence status.

#### 6.4.2 Journal

estos ProCall uses a journal provided by the server. All conversations and calls will always be stored on estos UCServer irrespective of these settings. Specifically, estos ProCall enables you to copy journal entries also into Outlook® or IBM Notes®.

#### Select data source:

If you use both Outlook® and IBM Notes®, you may selected your preferred system as a data source.

### Setup journal file

estos ProCall always lays out the journal copies in the set journal folder. If another journal folder should be used, this can be changed here with the "Search" button. Please note that only the journal folder can be selected in the choice dialog. Select "default" to activate the default-journal folder.

### Create automatic journal copies

In addition to the option of placing a copy of a journal entry in Outlook® or IBM Notes® manually via the context menu, estos ProCall can also prepare automated journal entries of telephone calls in Outlook® or IBM Notes®:

#### For a call memo

Activate this option, and estos ProCall will always store a journal copy in Outlook® or IBM Notes® as soon as you enter a memo about the call in the call window while you speak.

#### • Contact from own mailbox

Activate this option and estos ProCall will always store a journal copy in Outlook® or IBM Notes® as soon as a contact from one of your personal contact files was assigned to the call.

- ★ Use the Journal browser for a more detailed call journal.
   ★ Since estos ProCall keeps a journal provided by the server, journal entries for every call in Outlook® or IBM Notes® are not necessary. This saves unnecessary objects and ensures lasting high-quality performance of Outlook® and IBM Notes®, respectively.
   ★ You can see an overview of your last calls in the estos ProCall main window if you click the Journal tab.
- For special requirements, it may be necessary to save all calls as journal entries in Outlook® or IBM Notes®. This service can be activated in the Windows® registry. Details can be found at Control functions via Windows® Registry. Please note that activation of this function is not recommended!

### 6.4.3 DATEV integration - Automatic Data Transfer

estos ProCall can automatically synchronize data between DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro and estos ProCall in large part. By setting "Automatic Data Transfer", all phone calls will be synchronized (regardless of any properties) with DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro. Setting the following options has a restrictive effect (similar to black listing) on synchronization with DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro.

- Answered Calls Only: Missed calls will not be synchronized automatically with DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro. However, they can be subsequently synchronized from the estos ProCall Journal for Unanswered Calls
- External Calls Only: Calls from your organization will not be automatically synchronized against DATEV Arbeitsplatz pro.
- **DATEV Contacts Only:** Only those calls from contacts that have already been created in the DATEV master data service (SDD) will automatically be synchronized with DATEV Arbeitsplatz Pro. A

connection to the DATEV master data services (SDD) must have been configured already and be available for this feature.

### 6.5 Collaboration

In **Colaboration** the behavior of the client regarding chat from other estos ProCall users and notifications of presence changes of contacts are described.

- Chat
- Notification window
- Audio/Video wizard

### 6.5.1 Chat

# Do not display status reports

If you activate this option, no status reports on the chat and your callers will be shown.

### Display time without user interaction

If you didnt respond to a new chat, the chat window will be faded out after a specific time and a new chat will be added to the speech bubble info window. As soon as you respond to a chat message, the window will not be faded out automatically any more.

### Transparency, support display and fading out

The chat window supports transparency and is generally faded in and out. If you do not wish to use this function, deactivate transparency.

#### Window position

You can determine where a message window opened by estos ProCall should be displayed.

### • Default position (task bar icon)

ProCall opens the chat window to a suitable location on the screen. Other, already opened windows of ProCall are not superimposed.

### • Remember last position

If you close a message window, the position is stored and displays new windows there.

### • Define position using preview

Open a chat window with the button "Preview" and place this at the position where future windows are to be opened. As soon as you close the window, the position will be stored.

### • At mouse position

The mouse cursor will be used as a reference position, so that the window will always appear in the immediate vicinity of the window(s) being used for work.



These settings do not apply for chats that have been started by the user. In this case, the message window will always be opened at the mouse position.

## 6.5.2 Notification window

Notification windows can draw the user's attention to certain presence changes of contacts in Favorites. These appear for specially selected user then a small notification window, in the short type of change is indicated and which contact is concerned.

#### Notification in case of the following event:

#### • Contact becomes available.

The notification window appears when a tagged contact logs on, switches from the status "Inactive" to "Available" or switches from "Absent" to "Available".

### • Contact signs out.

The notification window indicates when a tagged contact signs out.

#### • Contact has a call to pick up.

The notification window appears when a call rings for the tagged contact while the tagged contact is not "available", but contact permits picking the call.

#### Display duration

The notification window will fade out after a certain time. With this setting, you can define the time period yourself.

### Transparency, support display and fading out

The notification window supporty transparency and generally fades in and out. If you do not wish to use this function, deactivate transparency.

#### Window position

The position can be defined where a notification window opened by estos ProCall should be shown.

#### Default position (task bar icon)

estos ProCall will open a new window at a apropriate position on the screen. Other already open windows of estos ProCall will not be overlaped.

### • Remember last position

A notification window will appear at the same position where you have closed it or it was automatically hidden.

# • Define position using preview

Open a notification window with the button "Preview" and position it where future windows are to be opened. Moving the message box has no effect on the display position.

# 6.5.3 Audio/Video wizard

With the **initial startup** of the estos ProCall the user can decide if Audio and Video devices are to be used (for VideoChat), if Audio devices only are to be used (for AudioChat) or if no devices are to be used (Audio/VideoChat off). The selected configuration can be changed later anytime by pressing the AV device item at the Presence area. If an Audio or Video device is configured to be used an Audio/Video Wizard starts.

During **normal operation** the Audio/Video Wizard opens automatically if the device configured for Audio/VideoChat is removed and if another device could be selected. If another device is configured the new one is further on used but the old one stays known. This helps for example if laptops with docking stations are used. If the primary device is removed due to an undock event the secondary device is choosen automatically without the need of a new configuration.

### • Audio configuration

With the Audio Wizard the microphone and the speaker devices can be configured to be used with Audio/VideoChat. Pressing the "Devices" button opens the Windows® sound devices e.g. for configuring the Windows® standard devices or just for review. While the Wizard is open devices may be plugged in or removed. The list updates accordingly.

If the selected device supports call control with device buttons (Human Interface Device "HID" buttons, e.g. for accepting or dropping calls) a checkbox "Enable Hook switch support" is offered (otherwise disabled grey). If the option is checked Audio/VideoChats can be accepted or dropped per device button. The list of supported HID devices can be found below.



The test button offers a simple way to verify that your current device configuration is working with the

software. After pressing the microphone test button a LED bar lits according to your speech for some seconds. After pressing the playback test button a sound is played for some seconds to the selected speaker device. Pressing the button again while the test runs cancels the test.

### • Video settings

With the Video Wizard the camera device can be configured to be used with VideoChat. The actually selected camera starts immediately and a test picture is shown. This helps identifying the selected camera device and the camera can be adjusted before a VideoChat starts the first time.

If the selected camera device supports to be remote controlled per software the option "Enable remote control of the local camera" checkbox becomes enabled (otherwise disabled grey). If checked the local user can move the remote camera. The camera can be turned to the left (arrow key left), to the right (arrow key right), upwards (arrow key up) and downwards (arrow key down). Further it is possible to zoom-in (key "-") and to zoom-out (key "+"). The controlling user may also move the remote camera by using the mouse in the main Video picture with the related overlay buttons (see also Conversation window). The list of supported devices can be found below.
